For an Ordinance designating the projects to be undertaken and funded with the proceeds of any general obligations bonds authorized by voters at the November 7, 2017 election.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. The Mayor and Council designate the following projects and level of funding to be undertaken with the proceeds of any general obligations bonds authorized by voters at the November 7, 2017 election.

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5 **Section 2.** If any project listed in Section 1 of this Ordinance is held to be invalid by a court of
6 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the other parts and provisions of any general
7 obligations bonds authorized by voters at the November 7, 2017 election and this Ordinance.

8 **Section 3.** Within each purpose, any modifications to add or remove a line item project will
9 require an amendment of this Ordinance by the Denver City Council.

10 **Section 4.** The Chief Financial Officer, as the Manager of Finance/*Ex-Officio* Treasurer shall
11 describe progress of the expenditure of the funds for each purpose listed above in a report to a
12 committee of the Denver City Council at least annually.

13 **Section 5.** This Ordinance shall be effective upon passage by the electorate of the
14 November 7, 2017 ballot question(s) that authorize the any general obligation bonds for the purposes
15 referenced herein.
