## BY AUTHORITY COUNCIL BILL NO. CB12-0823 ORDINANCE NO. SERIES OF 2012 **COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE:** Land Use, Transportation & Infrastructure A BILL For an ordinance assessing the annual costs of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Delgany Street Pedestrian Mall Local Maintenance District upon the real property, exclusive of improvements thereon, benefited.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

**Section 1.** Upon consideration of the recommendation of the Manager of Public Works that an ordinance be enacted for the purpose of assessing the annual costs of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Delgany Street Pedestrian Mall, for the upcoming year, upon the real property, exclusive of improvements thereon benefited the Council finds, as follows:

- (a) A local maintenance district providing for the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Delgany Street Pedestrian Mall, was created by Ordinance No. 63, Series of 2002 and amended by Ordinance No. 755, Series of 2002;
- (b) The annual cost of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Delgany Street Pedestrian Mall is \$15,195.00, which amount the Manager of Public Works has the authority to expend for the purposes stated herein;
- (c) The Manager of Public Works has complied with all provisions of law relating to the publishing of notice to the owners of real properties to be assessed and to all persons interested generally, and the Council sitting as a Board of Equalization has heard and determined all written complaints and objections, if any, filed with the Manager of Public Works;
- (d) The real property within the Delgany Street Pedestrian Mall will be benefited in an amount equal to or in excess of the amount to be assessed against said property because of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of said Pedestrian Mall.
- **Section 2.** The annual cost of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Delgany Street Pedestrian Mall to be assessed against the real properties, exclusive of improvements thereon, benefited are hereby approved.
- **Section 3.** The annual costs of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Delgany Street Pedestrian Mall in the amount of \$15,195.00 are hereby assessed against the real properties, exclusive of improvements thereon, within said local maintenance district as follows:

NOTE: Where a series of lots is followed by "inclusive", the amount appearing after the series shall be the total for all lots in the series. Where a series of lots is not followed by "inclusive", the amount appearing after such series shall be the assessment for each lot in the series.

- 14 **Section 4**. The assessments made pursuant hereto shall be a lien in the several amounts
- 15 assessed against each lot or tract of land set forth in Section 3 herein, and such lien shall have
- the priority of the lien for local public improvement districts.
- 17 **Section 5**. Without demand, said assessments as set forth in Section 3 herein, shall be due and
- 18 payable on the first day of January of the year next following the year in which this assessing
- 19 ordinance became effective, and said assessments shall become delinquent if not paid by the
- 20 last day of February of the year next following the year in which this assessing ordinance
- 21 became effective. A failure to pay said assessments as hereinabove set forth shall subject the
- 22 property subject to the assessment to sale as provided by the Charter of the City and County of
- 23 Denver.

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- 24 **Section 6**. Any unspent revenue and revenue generated through investment shall be retained
- 25 and credited to the Delgany Street Pedestrian Mall Local Maintenance District for future long
- term or program maintenance of the District.
