


PoP Communications

LIVESTOCK CENTER

The Sue Anschutz-Rodgers Livestock Center will be the heart of the new NWC campus. Designed to include flexible, year-round space that will support a wide variety of activities, such as community events, sporting events, graduations, concerts, livestock auctions, trade shows, banquets and other uses.





PEDESTRIAN & BETTIE CRAM DRIVE BRIDGES

Pedestrian Bridge – Procurement underway for this new bridge to improve east/west campus connectivity across nine railroad tracks and connect to the RTD N Line Commuter Rail.

Bettie Cram Drive Bridge – New bridge across the South Platte River at 48th Avenue connecting to Washington Street (west) and Marion Underpass to Brighton Blvd. (east).



EQUESTRIAN CENTER DEVELOPMENT











- Equestrian Center: Show arena, stables and paddocks
- Hotel: Full-service, 160 rooms
- Housing: 30-40 units (100% income restricted)
- Parking Garage: 580 campus spaces
- Armour Administration Building: Adaptive reuse
- Community Building: 4,000sf dedicated use
- Plaza and Open Space: ~5-acres

Outreach and Engagement Plan is designed to:

- Address both citywide and site-specific needs.
- Reflect the **priorities of GES** residents.
- Build trust and **strengthen relationships** within the GES community.
- Advance community priorities and community benefits.


Drivers of the Engagement Approach:

- Reinvest in the Community: Dedicate a significant portion of engagement resources back into the community to support local capacity and leadership development.
- Partner with Community Organizations: Collaborate with multiple trusted community-based organizations, ensuring they play key roles in executing engagement activities.
- **Empower Resident Leadership:** Train and support up to 24 resident block captains to actively gather input from their neighbors.

TRIANGLE ENABLING PROJECTS

Vibrant Denver Bond – Marion Underpass connecting Bettie Cram Drive to Brighton Blvd. and Washington Street, providing safe, multi-modal connection.

Environmental Cleanup – Remediation of the former DPS Bus Barn that sits on historic urban fill. NWCO & DDPHE have stabilized the site and installed venting and other measures to prepare for future development. This project will remove former landfill material & replace with clean fill.





CH2M HILL ENGINEERS - AMENDMENT

Approves the third amendatory agreement for contract to extend the term and increase the capacity in order to provide continuing program and critical project management services in support of the delivery of the National Western Center Program.

- Scope of Services: Program management, project management, subject matter expertise, staff augmentation, workforce and small business development, city staff training, and support for related campus services, planning, and development.
- Source of Funds: No additional funding is being requested. All work associated with this amendment will be covered using existing, already-allocated program funds.
- WBE/MBE/DBE Commitments: 10%, current utilization is at 18%.
