6. **General description of proposed ordinance including contract scope of work if applicable:**

- The proposed seventh amendment would allow the extension of the agreement for six (6) months through December 31, 2015; and, appropriate an additional \$708,000 bringing the total agreement amount to \$10,021,849.00
- A six-month extension would ensure continuity of the program while a formal Request for Proposal (RFP) process is taking place. Monthly cost and all other terms and conditions would remain constant during this six-month extension. Services levels will remain at 7 days/week utilizing five Photo Radar Speed Enforcement vans.
 - City RFP process was delayed several months while Legislation was being proposed in the State Senate; DPD and City Purchasing decided to hold the RFP from release until proposed legislation was far enough along to determine direction of the overall program. DPD is now asking for a six month extension to allow for the RFP process to be completed; and for uninterrupted continuity of the services.
- Continued operation of the photo speed enforcement program utilizes an automated vehicle identification system; and is part of an overall traffic management strategy to enhance safety on City streets, promote traffic calming, improve neighborhood quality of life, and improve or maintain current levels of traffic mobility.
