PURPOSE:	Appointments and Reappointments to the Denver Latino Commission

Purpose:

The Denver Latino Commission's mission is to oversee, recommend and influence policies that affect the Denver Latino community while maintaining and encouraging a constituent focus.

Appointment Process:

The Mayor appoints up to 21 members and City Council confirms appointment for 3-year terms, with a 3-term limit.

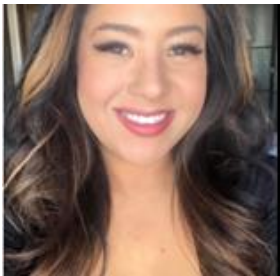


Adrian Covarrubias
