A BILL

For an ordinance adding section 39-121(20) of the Revised Municipal Code establishing certain new fees for private outdoor fee-based activity in parks.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. That subsection 20 (Private outdoor fee-based activity fee) of section 121 (Schedule for Use of Facilities) of Article IV (Fees and Charges) of Chapter 39 (Parks and Recreation) of the Revised Municipal Code shall be added to read as follows:

39-121. (20) Private outdoor fee-based activity (POFA) fee: The six-month season, the tier 1 and the tier 2 designations, and the park roads and trails that may be permitted for POFA shall be determined and made public by the manager of parks and recreation.

a. *Six to twenty-five participants for a single POFA (for six-month season):*

	<u>Tier 1</u>	<u>Tier 2</u>
Turf area in park:	\$300.00	\$200.00
Park road/trail:	\$150.00	\$100.00

b. *One to five participants for a single POFA (for six-month season):*

	<u>Tier 1</u>	<u>Tier 2</u>
Turf area in park:	\$100.00	\$100.00
Park road/trail:	\$100.00	\$100.00

c. Non-profit discount (permit fee only): 50% for Tier 1 and Tier 2.

d. *General fees.*

Application fee	\$25.00 per permit issued (one per park)
Cancellation fee – 30 days or more before	15%
Cancellation fee – less than 30 days before	100%

Section 2. That this ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage.
