- Contractor provides equipment and services related to high-tech audio equipment capable of detecting and pinpointing the location of gunfire within the service area(s).
- Contract will provide for the continued Alert and Analysis service of the current 3.0 square mile coverage area. This initial system was provided by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms (ATF).
- Contract will also provide for the expansion of the system to an additional six (6.0) square miles within the City of Denver.
- Funding is provided for through a combination of Federal Justice Assistance Grants (JAG) 2014-DJ-BX-0986 and 2015-DJ-BX-0476; and appropriation within the Denver Police Department general fund.

- System allows Denver Police uniform officers to respond to an exact location of a shooting. System has proven success in alerting the DPD within 38 seconds after the first gunshot is fired and zeroes in on the shooter's location within 82 feet of the incident.
- System increases the probability of identifying a suspect while they are still in the incident area; and increases possibility of an arrest.
