We are pleased to send out this Letter of Intent regarding the 2022 Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) program.

Federal funding in support of EMPG for State and local programs has remained steady and continues to provide our partners the opportunity to further develop and improve the emergency management programs for their respective communities. Due to Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) timing of the grant cycle, DHSEM anticipates receiving the award letter from FEMA around August 2022. For the 2022 EMPG, each approved jurisdiction should plan to receive a Grant Award Letter, barring any unforeseen changes in funding at the Federal level around August 2022.

The City and County of Denver can anticipate an award in the amount of \$89,728 for the performance period of January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022.
