## **Description:**

Strategies to Advance Colorado's Highly Skilled Workforce: H-1B Technical Skills Training Grant The City and County of Denver, Denver County, will utilize H1-B State training grant funds to contract with Internation Business Machines (IBM-Washington) to provide technical skills training to a minimum of 385 incumbent workers. This technical grant was awarded to develop Colorado's Highly Skilled Workforce. IBM will provide targeted Information Technology, STEM – Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services, and Advanced Manufacturing training. IBM will also be responsible for Cash Match requirements.

• Grant Objective: The "Strategies to Advance Colorado's Highly Skilled

Workforce" proposal (H1B) will utilize other training (not On-the-Job Training) to provide the necessary skills and competencies for employment in the targeted occupations: information technology, advanced manufacturing, and STEM (Aerospace).

- Populations to be served include incumbent workers (70%) and unemployed or long-term unemployed (30%)
- o IBM will serve 385 incumbent workers in Denver with the following outcomes:
  - Ensure that participants meet the grant eligibility requirements and provide required documentation per the Statement of Work.
  - Ensure that 100% of participants complete training.
  - Ensure that 100% of trained participants retain employment for a minimum of 6 months.

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- Ensure that 100% of participants receive a minimum of three education/training related credentials.
- Ensuring that a minimum of 100% of incumbent workers have an average wage of \$35-\$38 an hour.
- The terms and conditions of the contract are as follows:

\*Administrative and program costs are included in the total grant award and will be allocated accordingly.

- State of Colorado Department of Labor and Employment (CDLE) was awarded \$5,000,000.00 over 4 years. State requirements included 50% employer match which could include employee training time and limited facility costs. An average placement wage for incumbent workers of \$79,200 and average placement wage for unemployed workers of \$63,280 is required. Requirements are State aggregate.
- CDLE strategically worked with both IBM and Lockheed to insure that both participants will exceed the match requirements at 100% and the incumbent worker average wage. This will allow flexibility in regions across the state to engage employer participants that may not attain the average wage requirements and/or meet the 50% match goal due to a region's average wage.
- IBM will provide access to their 700 plus certifications and credentials to degree granting institutions as part of the H1B agreement.
