**6. General description of proposed ordinance including contract scope of work if applicable:**

The Office of Behavioral Health Strategies (OBHS) was created after the City's 2016 budget was finalized. Because OBHS' structure was determined after funds had been appropriated for 2016, budget that OBHS administers is currently spread across multiple agencies. This ordinance request consolidates funding previously appropriated for marijuana youth diversion programming in Excise and Licenses and the Office of Marijuana Policy as well as funding for the Office of Drug Strategy in OBHS for easier administration.

The proposed ordinance includes the following specific actions:

- Rescinds \$234,673 from Excise and Licenses' 2016 General Fund budget (01010-4001400). This budget was originally appropriated in 2015 then encumbered for marijuana youth diversion programming with nonprofit organizations and rolled to 2016.
- Rescinds \$750,000 from the Office of Marijuana Policy's 2016 General Fund budget (01010-0191100).
- Rescinds \$410,944 from 2016 General Contingency (01010-2580910). This is the remainder of the amount that was contracted out for marijuana youth diversion programming in Excise and Licenses in 2015 but could not be encumbered and rolled to 2016 due to it being for internal contracts with the Office of the Independent Monitor and the Department of Safety.
- Transfers the \$1,395,617 (the sum of the \$234,673, \$750,000 and \$410,944 identified above) that is rescinded from the City's General Fund (01010) to the Crime Prevention and Control Fund (13821-5554000), out of which the Office of Behavioral Health Strategies is administered. The Crime Prevention and Control Fund is set up on a cash basis so by virtue of being transferred into this fund, these funds will be appropriated.

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- Transfers \$191,127 from DHS' Local Funded Community Services fund (13306-5552000) to the Crime Prevention and Control Fund (13821-5554000). Again, by virtue of being transferred into the Crime Prevention and Control Fund, which is set up on a cash basis, these funds will be appropriated.
