

## 2017 ADP = 2,187 2018 ADP Estimate = 2,110











#### 2017 & 2018 Bookings by Month




Average 101 Bookings per Day



#### 2017 & 2018 Releases by Month




Top 5 Releases - % of Bookings





#### MENTAL HEALTH

Subjects booked into the Denver Downtown Detention Center are given a behavioral health assessment by the Denver Health contract provider. If the person is assessed to have a risk of suicide/self-harm and/or mental health concerns, the Denver Health provider assigns the appropriate alert to the inmate (summarized below):

#### Suicidal Inmates Alerts


- **1. S1**: Acutely suicidal/self-harm patients that have a current extreme risk of suicide or self-harm.
- 2. S2: Acutely suicidal/self-harm patients that have a high risk of suicide or self-harm.


#### Mental Health Alerts

- 1. X03A: Includes psychotic and disorganized mentally ill patients who require intense psychiatric management and treatment
- **2. X03B**: These patients are currently exhibiting moderate or severe psychiatric symptoms, including: psychotic symptoms of auditory and other types of hallucinations, paranoia, delusional symptoms, mania, PTSD symptoms, anxiety disorder symptoms, or symptoms consistent with major depression.
- **3. XO3D**: Symptoms are minimal, absent, or appropriately managed with medication and/or other programming.













22% (approximately 7,500 inmates) in 2018 have been released with an active Mental Health Alert

164 Releases to PTS involved an Active 3A or 3B MH Alert


