WHEREAS, the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District was initiated by petition filed with the City Clerk, ex-officio Clerk of the City and County of Denver, City Clerk File No. 92-546A and was created and established pursuant to Ordinance No. 501, Series of 1992; and

WHEREAS, the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District Service Plan directs that the District shall have perpetual existence unless, in the tenth year after its creation and every tenth year thereafter, the district fails to file with the City Council a petition requesting continuance signed by persons who own real and personal property in the District's service area having a valuation for assessment of not less than fifty percent of the valuation for assessment of all real and personal property in the service area and who own at least fifty percent of the acreage in the District; and

WHEREAS, the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District Service Plan directs further that the City Council shall determine whether the petition threshold has been met and may upon the filing of any challenge to the signatures, hold a public hearing to determine whether the petition threshold has been met; and

WHEREAS, on August 2, 2001, the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District filed a Petition For The Continuance of The Downtown Denver Business Improvement District In The City And County Of Denver which was approved by City Council pursuant to Ordinance No. 880, Series of 2001, which extends the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District through 2011; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Directors of the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District circulated a petition for the continuance of the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District for an additional 10 year period through 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District passed a resolution on August 4, 2011 which determined that the petitions signed by persons who own real and personal property in the District were in excess of the required percentages for the valuations of assessment of all real and personal property in the service area of the District as well as the required percentage of acreage in the District; and

WHEREAS, on or about September 6, 2011, the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District filed petitions and a request for continuance with the City, which may be found at City Clerk File No. 01-1026-A, which includes the Board's Resolution and request that City Council adopt an Ordinance for the continuance of the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District for an additional ten year period; and

WHEREAS, the petitions filed by the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District meet and exceed the threshold required by the Service Plan and demonstrate overwhelming support for continuation of the District for another ten-year period by persons who own real and personal property in the District's service area.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. The petitions filed by the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District in accordance with its approved Service Plan, which were filed in the office of the Clerk and Recorder, Ex-Officio Clerk of the City and County of Denver, City Clerk File No. 01-1026-A, were signed by persons who own real and personal property in the District's service area having a valuation for assessment of not less than fifty percent of the valuation for assessment of all real and personal property in the service area and who own at least fifty percent of the acreage in the service area, meet and exceed the threshold established by the District Service Plan for continuation of the district for another ten-year period through 2021; and, in reliance upon the Resolution of the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District's Board of Directors, which presents the petitions to City Council and requests that City Council approve the continuation of the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District, the City Council hereby approves continuation of the Downtown Denver Business Improvement District for an additional ten year period through 2021.
