**WHEREAS**, Ordinance No. 374, Series of 2022, increased "Administration" allocation due to interest earnings generated by ARPA monies previously authorized through Ordinance No. 1192, Series of 2021; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 373, Series of 2022, established the American Rescue Plan Act Capital Project Fund (38395) in the Grant and Other Money Projects Fund Series, and authorized a cash transfer from the ARPA Operating Grant Fund to the new ARPA Capital Project Fund to support capital investments and improvements at shelters and recreation centers; and

**WHEREAS**, Ordinance No. 969, Series of 2022, increased the "Recovery" spending allocation to support individuals and families who have experienced food insecurity due to an economic impact by COVID-19 and the effects of inflationary pressures by providing gift cards and vouchers and by expanding culturally relevant food box distribution; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 1450, Series of 2022, allocated a second cash disbursement of \$154 million from Treasury for allocations and programs that were determined through a deliberative process based on input from the community and the Stimulus Investment Advisory Committee (SIAC), allocated cash in the Administration category for program evaluation, and reallocated from premium pay based on expenditures, and authorized capital equipment; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 0548, Series of 2023, allocated amounts in the "Recovery," "Revenue Loss," "Premium Pay," and "Administration" categories in Fund 11011, to support rental assistance programs and The My Spark program; corrected allocations to support the intent of Ordinance 1450, series of 2022; and transferred cash from the ARPA Operating Fund to the ARPA Capital Fund and provided approval to purchase capital equipment; and

**WHEREAS**, Ordinance No. 1326, Series of 2023, allocated amounts in the "Recovery" category to make an allocation based on previously unallocated interest earnings to support the City's 2023 goal to shelter 1,000 individuals; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 1683, Series of 2023, allocated amounts in the "Recovery" category to make an allocation based on previously unallocated interest earnings to support the Denver Basic Income Project and the City's 2023 goal to shelter 1,000 individuals, and to adjust allocations in the Revenue Loss and Recovery categories to align planned program uses with ARPA federal guidelines; and

**WHEREAS**, Ordinance No. 802, Series of 2024, adjusted allocations in the Administration and Recovery categories and allocated interest earnings in the Recovery category to support the City's "All In Mile High" Program; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to amend Ordinance No. 591, Series of 2021, as amended by the subsequent ordinances, to adjust allocations in the "Administration" and "Recovery" categories to add \$499,737 to support the Temporary Rental and Utility Assistance (TRUA) program, administered by the Department of Housing Stability, and adds \$191,222 to support a contact with Denver Health, administered by Denver Department of Public Health (DDPHE), and allocates interest earnings in the "Revenue Loss" category to support the Denver Department of Public Health (DDPHE) and FEMA Public Assistance Arbitration related to the City's COVID claim;

## NOW, THERFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

**Section 1.** Section 6 of Ordinance No. 591, Series of 2021, as amended by Ordinance 706, Series of 2021, as amended by Ordinance No. 1145, Series of 2021, as amended by Ordinance No. 1192, Series of 2021, and as amended by Ordinance No. 374, Series of 2022, as amended by Ordinance No. 969, Series of 2022, as amended by Ordinance No. 1450, Series of 2022, as amended by Ordinance No. 548, Series of 2023, as amended by Ordinance No. 1326, Series of 2023, as amended by Ordinance No. 1683, series of 2023, as amended by Ordinance No. 802, series of 2024, is amended to read as follows:
