6. **General description of proposed ordinance including contract scope of work if applicable:**

- The proposed grant agreement (CFDA #95.001) with Grant Number G15RM0018A has been issued a letter of intent to award a total of \$1,193,870.00.
- This ordinance would authorize for expenditures to cover the period from January 1, 2015 to December 31, 2016. The foregoing authorization is for 50% of the amount (\$596,935.00) indicated in the Letter of Intent (LOI) to fund from ONDCP for the H.I.D.T.A. FY15 program.
 - At such time the actual Statement of Grant Award is received by the Department of Safety; the remaining 50% appropriation and spending authority will be requested through City Council.
- This grant will support initiatives designed to implement the Strategy proposed by the Executive Board of the Rocky Mountain HIDTA and administered by the Denver Police Department;
 - Total funding of \$1,193,870 will be distributed within three initiatives
 - \$946,967 Front Range Task Force
 - \$78,383 Fugitive Location & Apprehension Group
 - \$168,520 Intelligence Initiative
 - Federal grant dollars will support three (3.0) FTE and uniform overtime:
 - 1.0 FTE DPD Lieutenant

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- 1.0 FTE DPD Executive Assistant III
- 1.0 FTE DPD Management Analyst
- Federal grant dollars will support four Denver vendor contracts:
 - The leasing of nine (9) vehicles used for investigation and surveillance purposes
 - The contracting of technical operational/investigative support
 - The contracting of IT network support
 - Telecommunication system/services
- Federal grant dollars will purchase technical investigative equipment (audio and visual); and computer equipment.
- Remaining federal grant dollars will purchase the programs' other service, supply, training, and travel expenses.
