








Further Enhancements

- Games










Layout






Pilot Project

- In 2016, open mid-July at earliest to October 31 at the latest. Contingent on approval of liquor license.
- If it successful and the community supports it,
 - Open in 2017 and 2018 between May 1 and October 31.
- The Southwest Rink at Skyline Park will remain open from November 1 to March 1.
- Will involve the operators of the Lowry Beer Garden and Lannie's Clocktower Cabaret to insure the beer garden is run professionally
