What is Diversion?

Intervention approaches that redirect participants away from formal processing in the justice system, while still holding them accountable for their actions. The goal of diversion is to remove youth and adults as early in the justice process as possible to avoid later negative outcomes associated with formal processing, such as increased odds of recidivism, stigmatization/labeling, and increased criminal justice costs.

The Purpose & Goal of Diversion

The Denver District Attorney's Diversion Programs provide culturally competent services that **repair** the harm caused by crime to victims and the community, increase social competency skills of offenders and **reduce** the likelihood of further involvement in the court system.

Juvenile

Ages 10 - 17

Criteria of Diversion Program

- Admit involvement, culpability, or guilt in offense
- Charges
 - Juvenile pre-file, post file, misdemeanor and felony
- Prior Criminal History
- Have not previously participated in Diversion Program
- Voluntarily agrees to participate
- Agree & Comply with Diversion Contract
- Diversion services are appropriate and can meet needs of client










