This agreement with CMTA, Inc is funded by the Climate Protection Fund to implement energy efficiency upgrades and conduct energy audits at municipal buildings, \$5,209,000 for the period ending December 31, 2028. CASR conducted energy audits in over 140 municipal buildings in 2024 utilizing four Energy Service Companies (ESCOs) including CMTA, Inc. This contract enables the implementation of energy conservation measures at municipal facilities in support of Denver's decarbonization and energy affordability goals.

The agreement with CMTA, Inc focuses primarily on improvements at facilities managed by Denver Arts & Venues, the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure, and Real Estate and can be used to support other sites and agencies if needed. Types of energy conservation measures include but are not limited to building automation controls upgrades and retrocommissioning, building envelope improvements such as insulation and door sweeps, LED lighting retrofits, and ASHRAE Level 2 Energy Audits.

Scope of work:

The agreement with CMTA, Inc focuses primarily on improvements at facilities managed by Denver Arts & Venues, the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure, and Real Estate and can be used to support other sites and agencies if needed. Types of energy conservation measures include but are not limited to building automation controls upgrades and retrocommissioning, building envelope improvements such as insulation and door sweeps, LED lighting retrofits, and ASHRAE Level 2 Energy Audits.

Was this contractor selected by competitive process?

RFP GS11136 was a competitive process to award multiple contracts for multiple phases of energy efficiency related work (audits à implementation of selected efficiency measures).

- The original plan to use an Energy Performance Contract as the subsequent contract mechanism did not happen, as the city chose to pay cash via CASR for the next phase instead. So, while the general spirit of the competitive RFP is the same, the contract mechanism is slightly different.

As such, the contracts are shown as “Sole Source” contracts in Jaggaer and come with a sole source justification.

In 2023, 4 out of 7 Energy Service Companies were awarded contracts to perform energy audits in CCD buildings. Schneider Electric Buildings Americas, Inc. was one of the awardees. As a part of their ASHRAE Level 2 energy audits they developed cost estimates, design work, and guarantees of performance for energy conservation measures for Denver Arts & Venues sites. To preserve the value of the existing the design work and maintain the guarantees of performance, a sole source contract will be extended to Schneider. This sole source agreement is consistent with the goals, scope and requirements of RFP GS 11136.
