ethnicity, or national origin. Race and ethnicity will not be the predominant factor determining the location of district boundaries if to do so would subordinate the other traditional race-neutral districting principles set forth herein. However, race and ethnicity will be taken into account to the extent necessary to comply with the Voting Rights Act and to avoid claims arising thereunder.

3. District lines will be drawn to create districts that are as compact as possible and contain contiguous territory. District lines will follow obvious geographic boundaries to the extent possible.

 Council districts will be comprised of whole election precincts, as required by Section 3.1.2 of the Charter of the City and County of Denver. Council will urge the Clerk & Recorder to draw precinct boundaries that will facilitate reasonable Council district boundaries.

5. Council will make every effort to consolidate traditional neighborhoods within one district to avoid multiple representation and to maintain as much as possible the existing relationships between council members and their present constituents. In order to help accomplish this goal, Council will urge the Clerk & Recorder to draw the boundaries of each precinct wholly within a neighborhood.

 Council will endeavor to preserve logical communities of interest and to preserve the core of existing constituencies traditionally represented by a particular Council district.

7. Redistricting will to the extent possible not result in two incumbent district Council members legally capable of running for re-election in 2015 residing in the same district.

SECTION 2. The Council adopts the following procedures for developing a redistricting plan for Council districts:

 The City Council President has appointed a Redistricting Committee responsible for coordinating the redistricting process and working with Denver GIS within the City's Technology Services Division to obtain the tabulations and maps of the City and County of Denver.

2. The Redistricting Committee will adopt a meeting schedule that is convenient to the public and Council members. Redistricting Committee meetings will be conducted in conformity with Denver's open meeting laws (D.R.M.C. 2-31, et. Seq.). Denver TV Channel 8 will televise all meetings.

1 2	3.	Council members will have access to the computer equipment, software and database used to prepare the redistricting plans. Council members
3		will have access to Council staff for research and mapping.
5	4.	Video of the Redistricting Committee's meetings and all documents and
6		maps will be available on the City's website at
7		www.DenverGov.org/CityCouncil. Council staff will maintain a complete
8		record of all meetings, hearings, reports, correspondence, exhibits, and
9		work papers throughout the redistricting process, and any documents
10 11		presented in the redistricting meetings will be available for inspection at the City Council Office.

13	5.	The City Council will make every effort to communicate the redistricting
14		process to interested constituent groups by conducting outreach through
15		various established media and communication outlets. The Redistricting
16		Committee will schedule no less than five public meetings, one in each
17		quadrant and one at a meeting of the Redistricting Committee at the City
18		& County Building, during the redistricting process to receive comments
19 20		from interested parties.
20 21	6.	City Council will hold at least one public hearing prior to voting on the
22	•	ordinance adopting a redistricting plan for City Council.
24	7.	The Redistricting Committee will submit its proposed redistricting plan to
25		the City Attorney's Office for review and legal assessment prior to
26 27		submission to the Council. The City Attorney's Office legal assessment will become part of the record of the redistricting process.
