## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This expenditure authorization will permit grant funds to flow from the Colorado Department of Labor (CDLE) Division of Employment and Training to the Denver Office of Economic Development for the following programs:

• <b>PY16 WIOA Adult</b>	<b>\$1,164,923.00</b>
• <b>PY16 WIOA Youth</b>	<b>\$1,151,666.00</b>
• <b>PY16 WIOA Dislocated Worker</b>	<b>\$ 783,008.00</b>
• <b>PY16 Wagner-Peyser Employment Services</b>	<b>\$1,322,121.00</b>
• <b>PY16 Employment Support Fund</b>	<b>\$1,065,917.00</b>
<b>Total</b>	<b>\$5,487,635.00</b>

This allocation differs from the previous year by \$758,113, a 13% decrease.

The WIOA Adult, Dislocated Workers, and Youth Services programs are federally funded programs designed to strengthen and improve the nation's public workforce system and help get Americans, including youth and those with significant barriers to employment, into high-quality jobs and careers and help employers hire and retain skilled works.

Wagner-Peyser, a federal program, provides funding for the following services: 1) to facilitate the match between job seekers and employers, 2) to provide labor market information to job seekers and employers, and 3) to make appropriate referrals to related employment and training programs.

The Employment Support Fund is state funding that supplements Wagner-Peyser related services.

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
