Business Development

- BR16- Amends Section 5-18 of the Denver Revised Municipal Code concerning privately financed commercial improvements on Denver International Airport land.
- BR16- Amends Section 5-37 of the Denver Revised Municipal Code concerning limitations on development within the Airport Influence Overlay District.

Infrastructure & Culture

- BR16- Approves a five-year \$913,972.80 intergovernmental agreement with 0229 the Colorado Department of Transportation through 06-30-21 to reimburse the City for ongoing maintenance of signs and pavement markings on state highways within Denver (20162727).
- BR16- Approves a five-year \$5,427,000 intergovernmental agreement with Colorado Department of Transportation through 06-30-21 to reimburse the City for ongoing maintenance of traffic signals on state highways within Denver (201627276).
- RR16- Grants a revocable permit to Denver Bike Sharing to encroach into the public right-of-way with a bicycle docking station at 1651 Wynkoop Street in Council District 9.
- RR16- Extends the contract with Outward Bound, Inc. through 9-28-21 and 0227 adds a snow removal provision to lease the lodge building and parking lot at Camp Rollandet Natural Area with no change in the lease amount (201102078).

Governance & Charter Review

RR16- Approves the Mayoral appointments of Kenneth Arellano, Jr. and Dollar 0228 Lee to the Denver Asian Pacific American Commission for terms

effective immediately and expiring 1-22-18, or until successors are duly appointed.

Safety & Well-being

- BR16- Amends a contract with the Denver Health and Hospital Authority to extend the contract term ten months through 12-31-16 and increase funding in the amount of \$56,405.06 for a new total of \$785,764.44 for health care and developing school readiness for Denver Great Kids Head Start Program (MOEAI 201311626-03).
- RR16- Approves a 40-year loan to Mental Health Center of Denver for \$600,000 to provide construction and permanent financing on a 60-unit affordable rental housing project located at 1601 South Federal Boulevard in Council District 2 (OEDEV 201525041-00).

Routine, non-controversial requests for ordinances that are not substantive policy changes may be placed on Consent Agendas for Council Committees each week with the approval of Committee chairs. Councilmembers receive the consent agendas for review and have until Thursday at noon to request that an item be scheduled for Committee discussion. If approved, items are placed on the Mayor-Council agenda the following week. This document outlines the items that were placed on consent agendas this week.
