**A RESOLUTION**

**Granting a revocable permit to Denver Bike Sharing to encroach into the right-of-way with a bicycle docking station at 1095 Delaware Street.**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:**

**Section 1.** The City and County of Denver hereby grants to Denver Bike Sharing, a Colorado corporation and its successors and assigns ("Permittee"), a revocable permit to encroach into the right-of-way with a bicycle docking station, matchstick bollards and concrete wheel stops ("Encroachments") at 1095 Delaware Street in the following described area ("Encroachment Area"):

Location Description 15th Submittal

1095 Delaware St., Denver, CO 80204

- Located on the West side of Delaware St., below curb 20 feet south of 11<sup>th</sup> Ave.
- Bike station footprint is 234 sq. ft

**Section 2.** The revocable permit ("Permit") granted by this Resolution is expressly granted upon and subject to each and all of the following terms and conditions:

(a) Permittee shall obtain a street occupancy permit from Public Works Permit Operations at 2000 West 3rd Avenue, 303-446-3759, prior to commencing construction.

(b) Permittee shall be responsible for obtaining all other permits and shall pay all costs that are necessary for installation and construction of items permitted herein.

(c) If the Permittee intends to install any underground facilities in or near a public road, street, alley, right-of-way or utility easement, the Permittee shall join the Statewide Notification Association of Owners and Operators of Underground Facilities by contacting the Utility Notification Center of Colorado, 12600 West Colfax Avenue, Suite B-310, Lakewood, Colorado 80215, at 303-232-1991. Further, Permittee shall contact the Utility Notification Center at 1-800-922-1987 to locate underground facilities prior to commencing any work under this permit.

(d) Permittee is fully responsible for any and all damages incurred to facilities of the Water Department and/or drainage facilities for water and sewage of the City and County of Denver due to activities authorized by the permit. Should the relocation or replacement of any

1 drainage facilities for water and sewage of the City and County of Denver become necessary as  
2 determined by the Manager of Public Works, in the Manager's sole and absolute discretion,  
3 Permittee shall pay all cost and expense of the portion of the sewer affected by the permitted  
4 structure. The extent of the affected portion to be replaced or relocated by Permittee shall be  
5 determined by the Manager of Public Works. Any and all replacement or repair of facilities of the  
6 Water Department and/or drainage facilities for water and sewage of the City and County of  
7 Denver attributed to the Permittee shall be made by the Water Department and/or the City and  
8 County of Denver at the sole expense of the Permittee. In the event Permittee's facilities are  
9 damaged or destroyed due to the Water Department's or the City and County of Denver's repair,  
10 replacement and/or operation of its facilities, repairs will be made by the Permittee at its sole  
11 expense. Permittee agrees to defend, indemnify and save the City harmless and to repair or pay  
12 for the repair of any and all damages to said sanitary sewer, or those damages resulting from the  
13 failure of the sewer to properly function as a result of the permitted structure.

14 (e) Permittee shall comply with all requirements of affected utility companies and pay for  
15 all costs of removal, relocation, replacement or rearrangement of utility company facilities.  
16 Existing telephone facilities shall not be utilized, obstructed or disturbed.

17 (f) All construction in, under, on or over the Encroachment Area shall be accomplished  
18 in accordance with the Building Code of the City and County of Denver. Plans and Specifications  
19 governing the construction of the Encroachments shall be approved by the Manager of Public  
20 Works and the Director of Building Inspection Division prior to construction. Upon completion, a  
21 reproducible copy of the exact location and dimensions of the Encroachments shall be filed with  
22 the Manager of Public Works.

23 (g) The sidewalk and street/alley over the Encroachment Area shall be capable of  
24 withstanding an HS-20 loading in accordance with the latest AASHTO Specifications. The  
25 installations within the Encroachment Area shall be constructed so that the paved section of the  
26 street/alley can be widened without requiring additional structural modifications. The sidewalk  
27 shall be constructed so that it can be removed and replaced without affecting structures within the  
28 Encroachment Area.

29 (h) Permittee shall pay all costs of construction and maintenance of the Encroachment.s  
30 Upon revocation of the permit or upon abandonment, Permittee shall pay all costs of removing the  
31 Encroachments from the Encroachment Area and return the Encroachment Area to its original  
32 condition under the supervision of the City Engineer.

33 (i) Permittee shall remove and replace any and all street/alley paving, sidewalks, and  
34 curb and gutter, both inside the Encroachment Area and in the rights-of-way adjacent thereto, that

1 become broken, damaged or unsightly during the course of construction. In the future, Permittee  
2 shall also remove, replace or repair any street/alley paving, sidewalks, and curb and gutter that  
3 become broken or damaged when, in the opinion of the City Engineer, the damage has been  
4 caused by the activity of the Permittee within the Encroachment Area. All repair work shall be  
5 accomplished without cost to the City and under the supervision of the City Engineer.

6 (j) The City reserves the right to make an inspection of the Encroachments contained  
7 within the Encroachment Area. An annual fee, subject to change, of \$200.00 shall be assessed.

8 (k) This revocable permit shall not operate or be construed to abridge, limit or restrict  
9 the City and County of Denver in exercising its right to make full use of the Encroachment Area  
10 and adjacent rights-of-way as public thoroughfares nor shall it operate to restrict the utility  
11 companies in exercising their rights to construct, remove, operate and maintain their facilities  
12 within the Encroachment Area and adjacent rights-of-way.

13 (l) During the existence of the Encroachments and this permit, Permittee, its  
14 successors and assigns, at its expense, and without cost to the City and County of Denver, shall  
15 procure and maintain a single limit comprehensive general liability insurance policy with a limit of  
16 not less than \$500,000.00. All coverages are to be arranged on an occurrence basis and include  
17 coverage for those hazards normally identified as X.C.U. during construction. The insurance  
18 coverage required herein constitutes a minimum requirement and such enumeration shall in no  
19 way be deemed to limit or lessen the liability of the Permittee, its successors or assigns, under the  
20 terms of this permit. All insurance coverage required herein shall be written in a form and by a  
21 company or companies approved by the Risk Manager of the City and County of Denver and  
22 authorized to do business in the State of Colorado. A certified copy of all such insurance policies  
23 shall be filed with the Manager of Public Works, and each such policy shall contain a statement  
24 therein or endorsement thereon that it will not be canceled or materially changed without written  
25 notice, by registered mail, to the Manager of Public Works at least thirty (30) days prior to the  
26 effective date of the cancellation or material change. All such insurance policies shall be  
27 specifically endorsed to include all liability assumed by the Permittee hereunder and shall name  
28 the City and County of Denver as an additional insured.

29 (m) Permittee shall comply with the provisions of Article IV (Prohibition of Discrimination  
30 in Employment, Housing and Commercial Space, Public Accommodations, Educational  
31 Institutions and Health and Welfare Services) of Chapter 28 (Human Rights) of the Revised  
32 Municipal Code of the City and County of Denver. The failure to comply with any such provision  
33 shall be a proper basis for revocation of this permit.

1 (n) The right to revoke this permit is expressly reserved to the City and County of  
2 Denver.

3 (o) Permittee shall agree to indemnify and always save the City and County of Denver  
4 harmless from all costs, claims or damages arising, either directly or indirectly, out of the rights  
5 and privileges granted by this permit.

6 (p) Matchstick bollards and concrete car stops are required for installation of the  
7 docking station.

8 **Section 3.** That the Permit hereby granted shall be revocable at any time that the  
9 Council of the City and County of Denver shall determine that the public convenience and  
10 necessity or the public health, safety or general welfare require such revocation, and the right to  
11 revoke the same is hereby expressly reserved to the City and County of Denver; provided  
12 however, at a reasonable time prior to Council action upon such revocation or proposed  
13 revocation, opportunity shall be afforded to Permittee, its successors and assigns, to be present at  
14 a hearing to be conducted by the Council upon such matters and thereat to present its views and  
15 opinions thereof and to present for consideration action or actions alternative to the revocation of  
16 such Permit.
