#### HIGH RETURN ON INVESTMENT

from Denver's SOUTH PLATTE RIVER

Denver's investments in the South Platte Riverand the related greenways through Denver led to tangible and proven benefits, as identified by an objective economic study completed in 2025.



In 1970, the parcels within one-half mile of the water and greenways ("Study Area") was valued, on average,



In 2025, the parcels in the same area are valued 84% HIGHER









+84%







At least \$11.9 billion in additional property market value would not exist if the conditions of 1965 persisted today. This value accounts for 75% of the total property value found within the Study Area and 6% of total property value found in Denver



As a result, the City and County of Denver see \$61.3 million in additional property taxes and Denver's schools receive \$40.5 million in additional funding.





#### South Platte River Environmental Education

SPREE's mission is to inspire meaningful personal connections with nature in order to foster a lifelong sense of pride in, belonging to, and stewardship for our natural world by connecting the children of Denver to the South Platte River through engaging educational experiences.

## Field Trips

School- year field trips run every weekday during the school year, September through December; February- May

Most programs are with DPS ECE-5th students

Take place in 6 Denver public parks

All curriculum is based on Colorado state education standards and Next Generation Science Standards (All curriculum is reviewed and updated annually)

- 3264 students in 2024; 88 trips
- 28 different schools 2024-2025 school year
- ½ trips conducted in Spanish, increasing annually

## Field Trip Costs by the Numbers

\$561

Cost to run a large trip (60 student capacity, 4 staff; not including overhead) \$130

Average price paid by class in 2024

\*All Excursions are subsidized by fundraising and grants to ensure cost is not a barrier to students



#### Free MOC Programs

- Custom field trips funded through My Outdoor Colorado (GOCO GenWild coalition)
  - All programs are run with no cost to students or schools
  - TGF is reimbursed per student through the GOCO grant
- Primarily work with DPS Discovery Link program
- Programs take place at school locations or as a walking field trip to avoid bus costs
- 17 so far in 2025 with ~5 more scheduled for fall 12 in 2024






## **Summer Camps**

- Hands-on education all day every day
- Guest speakers: DPR, DOTI, Nature's Educators
- 32 1st-5th graders per week
  - o 5:1 student:teacher ratio
- 21 half-price scholarships awarded
- 18 Leaders-In-Training (middle schoolers)
- 159 kids attended 2025

Employment for teens to better connect students with GLC opportunities
