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shall be amended by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as follows:

Sec. 18-102. - Longevity pay.

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(a) Effective January 1, 2009 2022, deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs, and the sheriff, upon reaching their fifth third anniversary date of employment, shall be paid longevity pay at the rate of seven dollars (\$7.00) per month for each year of service except that no employee shall receive longevity compensation in excess of one hundred seventy-five dollars (\$175.00) per month or two thousand one hundred dollars (\$2,100.00) per year. Notwithstanding the above, effective April 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021, there will be no longevity pay pursuant to this section paid to deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs, or the sheriff.

(b) Effective January 1, 2023, deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs, and the sheriff, upon reaching their third anniversary date of employment, shall be paid longevity pay at the rate of ten dollars (\$10.00) per month for each year of service.

20 Section 3. That effective January 1, 2022, Chapter 18, Article IV, Section 18-106, D.R.M.C., shall be amended by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as 22 follows:

24 Sec. 18-106. – Designation of holidays. 25

26 Deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs, and the sheriff shall receive eight (8) 27 hours of holiday leave on the following days:

 - Presidents' Day (third Monday in February); (3)

 - Labor Day (first Monday in September); (7)
- 36 (8) Veteran's Day (November 11);
 - Thanksgiving Day (fourth Thursday in November); (9)
 - Christmas Day (December 25); (10)
- 39 (11)Personal holiday (on a date chosen by the employee under procedures approved by 40 the undersheriff, or in the case of the undersheriff, the manager of safety). 41

42 Notwithstanding the above, the following designated holidays will not be recognized in 2021 by deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs, or the sheriff: Cesar Chavez day, Memorial 43 Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. 44 45

46 Section 4. That effective January 1, 2022, Chapter 18, Article IV, Section 18-110, D.R.M.C., 47 shall be amended by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as 48 follows: 49

50 Sec. 18-110. – Uniform maintenance.

r	An annual allowance shall be paid to deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs,
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3	and the sheriff for the maintenance of uniforms in the amount of six hundred fifty dollars (\$650.00).
4	This payment shall be made at the end of each calendar year. Upon separation other than for
5	cause, this payment shall be prorated for the number of months served during the calendar year.
6	Notwithstanding the above, there will be no annual uniform allowance paid in 2021 to deputy sheriff
7	majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs, or the sheriff.
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9 An annual allowance shall be paid to deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs, and the sheriff for the maintenance of uniforms. This payment shall be made at the 10 11 end of each calendar year. Upon separation other than for cause, this payment shall be prorated for the number of months served during the calendar year. Effective January 1, 12 2022, the amount of the annual allowance shall be \$700; and effective January 1, 2023, the 13 amount of the annual allowance shall be \$750. 14
