Pretrial Services

Judges in Denver use electronic monitoring as a strategy to monitor high risk defendants as a condition of bond/release.

Electronic Monitoring Program Alternative to Jail/In Home Detention Sentence

Since 1994, an offender sentenced by the Court directly to in-home detention/electronic monitoring as an alternative to serving a jail sentence or in combination of serving a jail sentence.

Electronic Monitoring Overview

Types of Electronic Monitoring Technology:

- Global Positioning Satellite (GPS) Monitoring: Currently utilizing the Loc8 device through BI Inc to monitor a \checkmark client's location in near "real time" using GPS satellite technology. The equipment includes a one-piece ankle bracelet. Exclusion and/or Inclusion zones can be created and monitored. This technology can be utilized to assist in offenses where protective orders are in place.
- Alcohol Monitoring: Currently utilizing the Soberlink handheld device (SL3) through BI Inc to breath test clients at \checkmark various intervals throughout the day and the Trans dermal Alcohol device (TAD) to measure ethanol emitted through the skin.
- **Radio Frequency (RF) Monitoring:** The Program currently utilizes the HGR20/20 cellular device through BI Inc to monitor post conviction clients. The equipment includes both an ankle bracelet and a base station. Program staff will utilize the device to determine when a client leaves and returns to the location of the base station.



Request for Proposal (RFP) Process

- I. August 2021: Request for Proposals (RFP) issued
- II. September 2021: Request for Proposals Due
- III. Seven vendors from across the country submitted proposals for consideration
- IV. September-October 2021: Proposal Review/Scoring and equipment testing
- V. October 2021: Intent to Award letters sent to three vendors
- VI. Review Committee membership included statewide partners with experience with pretrial and electronic monitoring services:
- Representative from Mesa County Criminal Justice Services
- Representative from Jefferson County Justices Services
- Representative from Arapahoe County judicial Services
- Representative from Denver Juvenile Pretrial Services
- Three Representatives from Denver Adult Pretrial Services
