Section 2. That effective January 1, 2022, Chapter 18, Article IV, Section 18-102, D.R.M.C.,

1 shall be amended by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as 2 follows: 3 4

Sec. 18-102. - Longevity pay.

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- (a) Effective January 1, 2009 **2022**, deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs, and the sheriff, upon reaching their fifth third anniversary date of employment, shall be paid longevity pay at the rate of seven dollars (\$7.00) per month for each year of service except that no employee shall receive longevity compensation in excess of one hundred seventy-five dollars (\$175.00) per month or two thousand one hundred dollars (\$2,100.00) per year. Notwithstanding the above, effective April 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021, there will be no longevity pay pursuant to this section paid to deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs, or the sheriff.
- (b) Effective January 1, 2023, deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs, and the sheriff, upon reaching their third anniversary date of employment, shall be paid longevity pay at the rate of ten dollars (\$10.00) per month for each year of service.

Section 3. That effective January 1, 2022, Chapter 18, Article IV, Section 18-106, D.R.M.C., shall be amended by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as follows:

Sec. 18-106. – Designation of holidays.

Deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs, and the sheriff shall receive eight (8) hours of holiday leave on the following days:

- New Year's Day (January 1); (1)
- (2) Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day (third Monday in January);
- Presidents' Day (third Monday in February); (3)
- Cesar Chavez Day (last Monday in March); (4)
- (5)Memorial Day (last Monday in May);
- (6) Independence Day (July 4);
- Labor Day (first Monday in September); (7)
- (8)Veteran's Day (November 11);
- Thanksgiving Day (fourth Thursday in November); (9)
- Christmas Day (December 25); (10)
- (11)Personal holiday (on a date chosen by the employee under procedures approved by the undersheriff, or in the case of the undersheriff, the manager of safety).

Notwithstanding the above, the following designated holidays will not be recognized in 2021 by deputy sheriff majors, deputy sheriff division chiefs, or the sheriff: Cesar Chavez day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

Section 4. That effective January 1, 2022, Chapter 18, Article IV, Section 18-110, D.R.M.C., shall be amended by deleting the language stricken and adding the language underlined, to read as follows:
