Section 4. The Chief Financial Officer, as the Manager of Finance/Ex-Officio Treasurer shall describe progress of the expenditure of the funds for each purpose listed above in a report to a committee of the Denver City Council at least annually.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be effective upon passage by the electorate of the November 7, 2017 ballot question(s) that authorize the any general obligation bonds for the purposes referenced herein.
