13 The foregoing Revenue Loss allocation supports the cost of furlough restoration for all City 14 employees, the cost of restoring some services that were reduced in 2021 to balance the budget 15 as a result of revenue loss from COVID-19, and the cost of addressing certain operational 16 backlogs that arose as resources were reduced or diverted due to the pandemic. The foregoing 17 Premium Pay allocation supports payments to City employees whose regular, required duties 18 from March to December of 2020 put them at risk of COVID-19 exposure. The foregoing Recovery allocation supports Recovery investments identified through an extensive community 19 20 review process to support businesses, the community, housing and people experiencing 21 homelessness, and infrastructure. The foregoing Administration allocation supports a contract 22 to assist in the City's administration of ARPA funds, funding for data evaluation and analysis,

- 1 and public outreach expenses associated with the administration of the ARPA funding, as well
- 2 as technical support for community partners responsible for implementing ARPA program."
