#### 1. Goods/Services:

Barricade Holdings LLC dba Colorado Barricade Company, LLC; dba RDP Barricade Company, is a Limited Liability Company
formed or registered under the law of Colorado, ("Vendor") shall provide the goods, and any services to the City and County of
Denver, a Colorado municipal corporation (the "City"), all in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Master Purchase
Order.

### 3. Ordering:

The City shall purchase one or more of the goods/services by issuing a written purchase order(s) or similar appropriate written document ("Order"), each of which will be deemed incorporated into this Agreement for purposes of such Order only.

### 4. Pricing:

The pricing/rates for the goods/services is contained on **Exhibit A** and shall be held firm for the term of this Master Purchase Order.

#### 5. Extension or Renewal:

The effective period of this Master Purchase Order shall be three (3) years from the date of signature. It is also a specific provision of this Master Purchase Order that the City and the vendor may mutually agree to renew and continue the contract or agreement consummated under this Master Purchase Order for additional periods at the same terms and conditions. However, the entire term of the Master Purchase Order shall not extend beyond five (5) years.

#### 6. Non-Exclusive:

This Master Purchase Order is non-exclusive. City does not guarantee any minimum purchase other than as provided herein.

### 7. Inspection and Acceptance:

City may inspect all goods/services prior to acceptance. Payment does not constitute acceptance. Vendor shall bear the cost of any inspection/testing that reveal goods/services that are defective or do not meet specifications. City's failure to accept or reject goods/services shall not relieve Vendor from its responsibility for such goods/services that are defective or do not meet specifications nor impose liability on City for such goods/services. If any part of the goods/services are not acceptable to City, City may, in addition to any other rights it may have at law or in equity: (1) make a warranty claim; (2) repair and/or replace the goods or substitute other services at Vendor's expense; or (3) reject and return the goods at Vendor's cost and/or reject the services at Vendor's expense for full credit. Any rejected goods/services are not to be replaced without written authorization from City, and any such replacement shall be on the same terms and conditions contained in this Master Purchase Order. Vendor shall perform all services in accordance with the standard of care exercised by highly competent vendors who perform like or similar services.

#### 8. Shipping, Taxes and Other Credits and Charges:

All pricing is F.O.B. destination unless otherwise specified. Shipments must be marked with Vendor's name, the Master Purchase Order number, and contain a delivery or packing slip. Vendor shall not impose any charges for boxing, crating, parcel post, insurance, handling, freight, express or other similar charges or fees. Vendor shall notify City in writing of any price decreases immediately, and City shall receive the benefit thereof on all unshipped items. Vendor shall comply with any additional delivery terms specified herein. Vendor shall be responsible for the cleanup and reporting of any contamination (environmental or otherwise) or spillage resulting from the delivery and/or unloading of goods within twenty-four (24) hours of the contamination or spillage or sooner if required by law. Vendor shall procure all permits and licenses; pay all charges, taxes and fees; and give all notices necessary and incidental to the fulfillment of this Master Purchase Order and all cost thereof have been included in the prices contained herein. City shall not be liable for the payment of taxes, late charges or penalties of any nature, except as required by D.R.M.C. § 20-107, et seq. The price of all goods/services shall reflect all applicable tax exemptions. City's Federal Registration No. is 84-6000580 and its State Registration No. is 98-02890. Vendor shall pay all sales and use taxes levied by City on any tangible personal property built into the goods/services. Vendor shall obtain a Certificate of Exemption from the State of Colorado Department of Revenue prior to the purchase of any materials to be built into the goods/services and provide a copy of the Certificate to City prior to final payment.

### 9. Risk of Loss:

Vendor shall bear the risk of loss, injury or destruction of goods prior to delivery to City. Loss, injury or destruction shall not release Vendor from any obligation hereunder.

#### 10. Invoice:

Each invoice shall include: (i) the Purchase Order number; (ii) individual itemization of the goods/services; (iii) per unit price, extended and totaled; (iv) quantity ordered, back ordered, and shipped; (v) an invoice number and date; (vi) ordering department's name and "ship to" address; and (vii) agreed upon payment terms set forth herein.

### 11. Payment:

Payment shall be subject to City's Prompt Payment Ordinance D.R.M.C. § 20-107, et-seq. after City accepts the goods/services. Any other provision of this Agreement notwithstanding, in no event shall the City be liable for aggregate payments under this Master Purchase Order in excess of four million dollars (\$4,000,000.00). The Vendor acknowledges that any goods/services provided beyond those specifically described in **Exhibit A** are performed at Contractor's risk and without authorization from the City. City's payment obligations hereunder, whether direct or contingent, shall extend only to funds appropriated by the Denver City Council for the purpose of this Master Purchase Order, encumbered by the City after receipt of Vendor's invoice and paid into the Treasury of City. Vendor acknowledges that: (i) City does not by this Master Purchase Order, irrevocably pledge present cash reserves for payments in future fiscal years; and (ii) this Master Purchase Order is not intended to create a multiple-fiscal year direct or indirect debt or financial obligation of City. City may setoff against any payments due to Vendor any claims and/or credits it may have against Vendor under this Master Purchase Order.

### 12. Amendments/Changes:

Only the Manager of General Services or his delegate is authorized to change or amend this Master Purchase Order by a formal written change order. Any change or amendment that would cause the aggregate payable under this Master Purchase Order to exceed the amount appropriated and encumbered for this Master Purchase Order is expressly prohibited and of no effect. Vendor shall verify that the amount appropriated and encumbered is sufficient to cover any increase in cost due to changes or amendments. Goods/services provided without such verification are provided at Vendor's risk. The Vendor has no authority to bind City on any contractual matters.

### 13. Warranty:

Vendor warrants and guarantees to City that all goods furnished under this Purchase Order are free from defects in workmanship and materials, are merchantable, and fit for the purposes for which they are to be used and that any professional services associated with the goods, or standalone professional services under \$10,000, shall be performed in a workmanlike and professional manner with the degree of skill and judgment normally exercised by recognized professionals performing services of the same or substantially similar nature. For any goods or services which are or become defective within twelve (12) months (unless otherwise specified) after date of receipt by City, Vendor shall at no expense to City, at City's election and to City's satisfaction, either remedy any and all defects or replace the defective goods within seven (7) days of receipt of the defective goods or accept the defective goods for full credit and payment of any return shipping charges. Vendor shall be fully responsible for any and all warranty work, regardless of third-party warranty coverage. Vendor shall furnish additional or replacement parts at the same prices, conditions and specifications delineated herein.

## 14. Indemnification/Limitation of Liability:

Vendor shall indemnify and hold harmless City (including but not limited to its employees, elected and appointed officials, agents and representatives) against any and all losses (including without limitation, loss of use and costs of cover), liability, damage, claims, demands, actions and/or proceedings and all costs and expenses connected therewith (including without limitation attorneys' fees) that arise out of or relate to any claim of infringement of patent, trademark, copyright, trade secret or other intellectual property right related to this Master Purchase Order or that are caused by or the result of any act or omission of Vendor, its agents, suppliers, employees, or representatives. Vendor's obligation shall not apply to any liability or damages which result solely from the negligence of City. City shall not be liable for any consequential, incidental, indirect, special, reliance, or punitive damages or for any lost profits or revenues, regardless of the legal theory under which such liability is asserted. In no event shall City's aggregate liability exceed the agreed upon cost for those goods/services that have been accepted by City under this Master Purchase Order. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Master Purchase Order to the contrary, City in no way limits or waives the rights, immunities and protections provided by C.R.S. § 24-10-101, et seq.

### 15. Termination:

City may terminate this Master Purchase Order, in whole or in part, at any time and for any reason immediately upon written notice to Vendor. In the event of such a termination, City's sole liability shall be limited to payment of the amount due for the goods/services accepted by City. Vendor acknowledges the risks inherent in this termination for convenience and expressly accepts them. Termination by City shall not constitute a waiver of any claims City may have against Vendor.

### 16. Interference:

Vendor shall notify the Director of Purchasing immediately of any condition that may interfere with the performance of Vendor's obligations under this Master Purchase Order and confirm such notification in writing within twenty-four (24) hours. City's failure to respond to any such notice shall in no way act as a waiver of any rights or remedies City may possess.

### 17. Venue, Choice of Law and Disputes:

Venue for all legal actions shall lie in the District Court in and for City and County of Denver, State of Colorado, and shall be governed by the laws of the State of Colorado as well as the Charter and Revised Municipal Code, rules, regulations, Executive Orders, and fiscal rules of City. All disputes shall be resolved by administrative hearing, pursuant to the procedure established by D.R.M.C.§ 56-106. Director of Purchasing shall render the final determination.

### 18. Assignment/No Third Party Beneficiary:

Vendor shall not assign or subcontract any of its rights or obligations under this Master Purchase Order without the written consent of City. In the event City permits an assignment or subcontract, Vendor shall continue to be liable under this Master Purchase Order and any permitted assignee or subcontractor shall be bound by the terms and conditions contained herein. This Master Purchase Order is intended solely for the benefit of City and Vendor with no third party beneficiaries

#### 19. Notice:

Notices shall be made by Vendor to the Director of Purchasing and by City to Vendor at the addresses provided herein, in writing sent registered, return receipt requested.

### 20. Compliance With Laws:

Vendor shall observe and comply with all federal, state, county, city and other laws, codes, ordinances, rules, regulations and executive orders related to its performance under this Master Purchase Order. City may immediately terminate this Master Purchase Order, in whole or in part, if Vendor or an employee is convicted, plead nolo contendre, or admits culpability to a criminal offense of bribery, kickbacks, collusive bidding, bid-rigging, antitrust, fraud, undue influence, theft, racketeering, extortion or any offense of a similar nature.

### 21. Insurance:

Vendor shall secure, before delivery of any goods/services, the following insurance covering all operations, goods and services provided to City. Vendor shall keep the required insurance coverage in force at all times during the term of the Master Purchase Order, or any extension thereof, during any warranty period, and for three (3) years after termination of this Master Purchase Order. The required insurance shall be underwritten by an insurer licensed to do business in Colorado and rated by A.M. Best Company as "A-"VIII or better. Each policy shall contain a valid provision or endorsement requiring notification to the City in the event any of the required policies be canceled or non-renewed before the expiration date thereof. Such written notice shall be sent to the parties identified in the Notices section of this Agreement. Such notice shall reference the City contract number listed on the signature page of this Agreement. Said notice shall be sent thirty (30) days prior to such cancellation or non-renewal unless due to non-payment of premiums for which notice shall be sent ten (10) days prior. If such written notice is unavailable from the insurer, contractor shall provide written notice of cancellation, non-renewal and any reduction in coverage to the parties identified in the Notices section by certified mail, return receipt requested within three (3) business days of such notice by its insurer(s) and referencing the City's contract number. If any policy is in excess of a deductible or self-insured retention, City must be notified by Vendor. Vendor shall be responsible for the payment of any deductible or self-insured retention. The insurance coverages specified in this Master Purchase Order are the minimum requirements, and these requirements do not lessen or limit the liability of Vendor. Risk Management reserves the right to require additional policies and/or limits based on agreement scope of work. Vendor shall provide a copy of this Master Purchase Order to its insurance agent or broker. Vendor may not commence services or work relating to the Master Purchase Order prior to placement of coverage. Contractor certifies that the attached certificate of insurance attached to the Master Purchase Order documents, preferably an ACORD certificate, complies with all insurance requirements of this Master Purchase Order. The City's acceptance of a certificate of insurance or other proof of insurance that does not comply with all insurance requirements set forth in this Master Purchase Order shall not act as a waiver of Vendor's breach of this Master Purchase Order or any of the City's rights or remedies under this Agreement. The City's Risk Management Office may require additional proof of insurance, including but not limited to policies and endorsements. Vendor's insurer shall name as Additional Insured to its Commercial General Liability and Business Auto Liability policies the City and County of Denver, its elected and appointed officials, employees and volunteers. Vendor's insurer shall waive subrogation rights against the City. All sub-contractors and subconsultants (including independent contractors, suppliers or other entities providing goods/services required by this Master Purchase Order) shall be subject to all of the requirements herein and shall procure and maintain the same coverages required of Vendor. Vendor shall include all such entities as insureds under its policies or shall ensure that they all maintain the required coverages. Vendor shall provide proof of insurance for all such entities upon request by City. For Worker's Compensation Insurance, Vendor shall maintain the coverage as required by statute for each work location and shall maintain Employer's Liability insurance with limits of \$100,000 for each bodily injury occurrence claim, \$100,000 for each bodily injury caused by disease claim, and \$500,000 aggregate for all bodily injuries caused by disease claims. Vendor expressly represents to City, as a material representation upon which City is relying, that none of the Vendor's officers or employees who may be eligible under any statute or law to reject Workers' Compensation Insurance shall effect such rejection during any part of the term of this Master Purchase Order, and that any such rejections previously effected, have been revoked. Vendor shall maintain Commercial General Liability coverage with limits of \$1,000,000 for each occurrence, \$1,000,000 for each personal and advertising injury claim, \$2,000,000 products and completed operations aggregate, and \$2,000,000 policy aggregate. Vendor shall maintain Business Auto Liability coverage with limits of \$1,000,000 combined single limit applicable to all owned, hired and non-hired vehicles used in performing services under this Master Purchase Order. For Commercial General Liability coverage, the policy must provide the following: (i) That this Master Purchase Order is an Insured Contract under the policy; (ii) Defense costs in excess of policy limits(iii) A severability of interests, separation of insureds or cross liability provision; and (iv) A provision that coverage is non-contributory with other coverage or self-insurance provided by City. For claims-made coverage, the retroactive date must be on or before the first date when any goods or services were provided to City. Vendor must advise the City in the event any general aggregate or other aggregate limits are reduced below the required per occurrence limits. At their own expense, and where such general aggregate or other aggregate limits

have been reduced below the required per occurrence limit, the Contractor will procure such per occurrence limits and furnish a new certificate of insurance showing such coverage is in force.

### 22. Severability:

If any provision of this Master Purchase Order, except for the provisions requiring appropriation and encumbering of funds and limiting the total amount payable by City, is held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the validity of the remaining portions or provisions shall not be affected if the intent of City and Vendor can be fulfilled.

#### 23. Survival:

All terms and conditions of this Master Purchase Order which by their nature must survive termination/expiration shall so survive. Without limiting the foregoing, Vendor's insurance, warranty and indemnity obligations shall survive for the relevant warranty or statutes of limitation period plus the time necessary to fully resolve any claims, matters or actions begun within that period. Bonds shall survive as long as any warranty period.

### 24. No Construction Against Drafting Party:

No provision of this Master Purchase Order shall be construed against the drafter.

### 25. Status of Vendor/Ownership of Work Product:

Vendor is an independent contractor retained on a contractual basis to perform services for a limited period of time as described in Section 9.1.1E(x) of the Charter of City. Vendor and its employees are not employees or officers of City under Chapter 18 of the D.R.M.C. for any purpose whatsoever. All goods, deliverables, hardware, software, plans, drawings, reports, submittals and all other documents or things furnished to City by Vendor shall become and are the property of City, without restriction.

#### 26. Records and Audits:

Vendor shall maintain for three (3) years after final payment hereunder, all pertinent books, documents, papers and records of Vendor involving transactions related to this Master Purchase Order, and City shall have the right to inspect and copy the same.

#### 27. Remedies/Waiver:

No remedy specified herein shall limit any other rights and remedies of City at law or in equity. No waiver of any breach shall be construed as a waiver of any other breach.

### 28. No Discrimination in Employment:

Vendor shall not refuse to hire, discharge, promote or demote, or to discriminate in matters of compensation against any person otherwise qualified, solely because of race, color, religion, national origin, gender, age, military status, sexual orientation, marital status, or physical or mental disability; and Vendor shall insert the foregoing provision in any subcontracts hereunder.

## 29. Use, Possession or Sale of Alcohol or Drugs:

Vendor shall cooperate and comply with the provisions of Executive Order 94. Violation may result in City terminating this Master Purchase Order or barring Vendor from City facilities or from participating in City operations.

#### **30.** Conflict of Interest:

No employee of City shall have any personal or beneficial interest in the goods/services described in this Master Purchase Order; and Vendor shall not hire or contract for services any employee or officer of City which would be in violation of City's Code of Ethics, D.R.M.C. §2-51, et seq. or the Charter §§ 1.2.8, 1.2.9, and 1.2.12.

### 31. Advertising and Public Disclosure:

The Vendor shall not include any reference to the Master Purchase Order or to services performed or goods purchased pursuant to the Master Purchase Order in any of the Vendor's advertising or public relations materials without first obtaining the written approval of the Director of Purchasing.

### 32. No Employment of a Worker without Authorization to Perform work under the Master Purchase Order

- **a.** This Master Purchase Order is subject to Division 5 of Article IV of Chapter 20 of the Denver Revised Municipal Code, and any amendments (the "Certification Ordinance").
- b. The Contractor certifies that:
  - i. At the time of its execution of this Master Purchase Order, it does not knowingly employ or contract with a worker without authorization who will perform work under this Master Purchase Order, nor will it knowingly employ or contract with a worker without authorization to perform work under this Master Purchase Order in the future..
  - ii. It will participate in the E-Verify Program, as defined in § 8-17.5-101(3.7), C.R.S., and confirm the employment eligibility of all employees who are newly hired for employment to perform work under this Master Purchase Order.
  - iii. It will not enter into a contract with a subconsultant or subcontractor that fails to certify to the Contractor that it shall not knowingly employ or contract with a worker without authorization to perform work under this Master Purchase Order.
  - iv. It is prohibited from using the E-Verify Program procedures to undertake pre-employment screening of job applicants while performing its obligations under this Master Purchase Order, and it is required to comply with any and all federal requirements related to use of the E-Verify Program including, by way of example, all program requirements related to employee notification and preservation of employee rights.
  - v. If it obtains actual knowledge that a subconsultant or subcontractor performing work under this Master Purchase Order knowingly employs or contracts with a worker without authorization, it will notify such subconsultant or subcontractor and the City within three (3) days. The Contractor shall also terminate such subconsultant or

- subcontractor if within three (3) days after such notice the subconsultant or subcontractor does not stop employing or contracting with the worker without authorization, unless during the three-day period the subconsultant or subcontractor provides information to establish that the subconsultant or subcontractor has not knowingly employed or contracted with a worker without authorization.
- vi. It will comply with a reasonable request made in the course of an investigation by the Colorado Department of Labor and Employment under authority of § 8-17.5-102(5), C.R.S., or the City Auditor, under authority of D.R.M.C. 20-90.3.
- c. The Contractor is liable for any violations as provided in the Certification Ordinance. If the Contractor violates any provision of this section or the Certification Ordinance, the City may terminate this Master Purchase Order for a breach of the Master Purchase Order. If this Master Purchase Order is so terminated, the Contractor shall be liable for actual and consequential damages to the City. Any termination of a contract due to a violation of this section or the Certification Ordinance may also, at the discretion of the City, constitute grounds for disqualifying the Contractor from submitting bids or proposals for future contracts with the City.

### 33. Federal Provisions:

Where the source of the funds, directly or indirectly for this Purchase Order is the Federal Government, the Vendor agrees to the applicable provisions set out below. The Vendor shall be responsible for determining which terms are applicable to its products and/or services.

EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY COMPLIANCE Contractor agrees to comply with Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, entitled "Equal Employment Opportunity," as amended by Executive Order 11375 of October 13, 1967, and as supplemented in Department of Labor regulations (41 CFR Part 60). DAVIS-BACON ACT COMPLIANCE Contractor agrees to comply with the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 3148 to 3148) as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR part 5). ANTI-KICKBACK ACT COMPLIANCE Contractor agrees to comply with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (18 U.S.C. 874) as supplemented in Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 3). CONTRACT WORK HOURS AND SAFETY STANDARDS Contractor agrees to comply with Sections 102 and 107 of the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act (40 U.S.C. 327-333), as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR part 5) RIGHTS TO INVENTIONS MADE UNDER A CONTRACT OR AGREEMENT Contractor agrees to comply with 37 CFR part 401, "Rights to Inventions Made by Nonprofit Organizations and Small Business Firms Under Government Grants, Contracts and Cooperative Agreements," and any implementing regulations issued by the awarding agency. CLEAN AIR AND WATER REQUIREMENTS Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders, or requirements issued under the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 7401 et. seq.), and the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. 1251 et. seq.). Contractor agrees to report each violation of these requirements to the City and understands and agrees that the City will, in turn, report each violation as required to the appropriate EPA regional office. ENERGY CONSERVATION REQUIREMENTS The Contractor agrees to comply with mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the state energy conservation plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act. (42 U.S.C. 6201) NO SUSPENSION OR DEBARMENT Contractor certifies that neither it nor its Principals or any of its subcontractors is presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this Agreement by any Federal department or agency. BYRD ANTI-LOBBYING. If the Maximum Contract Amount exceeds \$100,000, the Contractor must complete and submit to the City a required certification form provided by the City certifying that it will not and has not used Federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any Federal contract grant of any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. 1352. Contractor must also disclose any lobbying with non-Federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any Federal award.

#### 34. Prevailing Wages

a. Vendor shall comply with, and agrees to be bound by, all requirements, conditions and City determinations regarding the Payment of Prevailing Wages Ordinance, Sections 20-76 through 20-79, D.R.M.C. including, but not limited to, the requirement that every covered worker working on a City owned or leased building or on City-owned land shall be paid no less than the prevailing wages and fringe benefits in effect on the date the bid or request for proposal was advertised. In the event a request for bids, or a request for proposal, was not advertised, Vendor shall pay every covered worker no less than the prevailing wages and fringe benefits in effect on the date funds for the contract were encumbered.

Prevailing wage and fringe rates will adjust on the yearly anniversary of the actual date of bid or proposal issuance, if applicable, or the date of the written encumbrance if no bid/proposal issuance date is applicable. Unless expressly provided for in this Master Purchase Order, Vendor will receive no additional compensation for increases in prevailing wages or fringe benefits

- c. Vendor shall provide the Auditor with a list of all subcontractors providing any services under the contract. Vendor shall provide the Auditor with electronically-certified payroll records for all covered workers employed under the contract.
- d. Vendor shall prominently post at the work site the current prevailing wage and fringe benefit rates. The posting must inform workers that any complaints regarding the payment of prevailing wages or fringe benefits may be submitted to the Denver Auditor by calling 720-913-5000 or emailing <a href="mailto:auditor@denvergov.org">auditor@denvergov.org</a>.
- e. If Vendor fails to pay workers as required by the Prevailing Wage Ordinance, Vendor will not be paid until documentation of payment satisfactory to the Auditor has been provided. The City may, by written notice, suspend or terminate work if Vendor fails to pay required wages and fringe benefits.

It is recommended that you use your Master Purchase Order No. – SC-00006788, in all future correspondence, billing, invoicing or other communications.

## 1. Description of the goods, and services related thereto, being purchased and pricing:

This Master Purchase Order covers traffic and crowd control devices; emergency traffic and crowd control devices and services; and planned traffic and crowd control services. The vendor shall provide sufficient materials, equipment, and labor to guarantee the delivery and removal of the requested traffic control devices. The vendor shall also repair or replace any damage or unsatisfactory traffic control devices within two hours of notification. The vendor shall also begin to remove traffic control devices within two hours after the City has completed use.

Traffic and crowd control devices include all manner of fencing, barriers, signage, cones, and other equipment necessary to direct traffic and people to specific locations, or form borders around an area. The vendor shall have the capability of providing special regulatory and guide signs. Signs may range in size from standard highway signs to specialized size signs. All signs must be constructed in accordance with the requirements and specifications of the manual on uniform traffic control devices (MUTCD), City standards, and applicable Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) standards. All signs must meet NCHRP-350 Crash Standards. Descriptions and standards of traffic control devices may be found at:

## MANUAL ON UNIFORM TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES

The City may require traffic and crowd control devices on an emergency basis (less than 24 hours). The vendor shall ensure sufficient stock of devices to meet all City emergency needs. Emergency deliveries are expected to arrive on site in no more than an hour after ordering. Vendor shall be on call for emergency traffic control devices 24/7/365. For items on site less than 24 hours, the rate shall be one day.

## 2. Delivery Considerations:

Delivery expectations shall be broken into two subcategories:

- Planned Events and Emergencies.
  - o For planned events (scheduled at least 24 hours in advance): Deliveries are to be made on the date and time requested by the agency. Vendor shall allow for sufficient time to set up and tear down per the written purchase order.
- For emergencies (less than 24 hours in advance):
  - o If an emergency condition is specified by the person making the request, the order shall be given priority over all other requests, and the requested barricades shall be placed in the requested location no later than 60 minutes after the request is received and all barricades and personnel must be picked up and the site clear within 60 minutes of event completion or within a City-approved delivery/pick up time window.

In addition, the City reserves the right to purchase from other sources those items which are required on an emergency basis and cannot be supplied immediately from stock by the vendor.

### 3. F.O.B. Point:

All prices quoted are a firm price F.O.B. Denver, Colorado, delivered to various locations through the Denver Metro Area and Denver International Airport.

### 4. Order Placement:

Various agencies may place an order using a City purchase order. Purchase orders may be a "blanket purchase order" type and encumber money for multiple future uses, or a "single order type" for single event expenditures. Regardless of which type of purchase order is issued to the vendor, agencies must always be quoted an estimated material quantity and cost using the pricing structure as indicated in this Master Purchase Order. These quotations must contain at minimum:

- 1. A quotation number for easy reference by both the City and the Vendor
- 2. The date that the quotation was requested
- 3. Who requested the quote/order?
- 4. Estimated placement location of services
- 5. Estimated duration of services
- 6. Line-item pricing quotation (quantity of items, unit pricing, extended pricing)
- 7. Purchase order number (if order is placed using a blanket purchase order)
- 8. Master purchase order number

## 5. Invoicing:

Different ordering agencies may have different invoicing requirements and procedures. Vendor shall coordinate their invoicing with a representative from the ordering agency. However, all invoices must include at minimum, the following items:

- 1. Date and time of order
- 2. Quotation reference number
- 3. Date and time of delivery
- 4. Date and time of pickup
- 5. Location of rental
- 6. Name of requestor
- 7. Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) call number, if applicable
- 8. Line-item pricing (quantity of items, unit pricing, extended pricing)

### 6. Laws, Regulations, Taxes and Permits:

The Vendor shall procure all permits and licenses, pay all charges, taxes, and fees, and give all notices necessary and incidental to the due and lawful prosecution of the work. All costs thereof shall be deemed to be included in the prices proposed for the work.

The Vendor, at all times, shall observe and comply with all federal, state, county, city and other laws, codes, ordinances, rules, and regulations in any manner affecting the conduct of the work.

Without limiting the foregoing, the Vendor shall establish appropriate procedures and controls so that services under this Contract will not be performed by using any alien who is not legally eligible for such employment under United States Immigration laws. Failure to comply with this condition satisfactorily may cause the City to terminate this Contract.

## 7. Payment Condition:

Partial payments are <u>not</u> authorized on individual written purchase orders issued for this procurement. Payment will be made upon final delivery and acceptance of all supplies or services ordered on each purchase order issued against the agreement. All Pricing is inclusive of any miscellaneous fees, delivery charges, fuel surcharges, etc. unless specifically noted in the pricing structure in EXHIBIT "B".

## 8. Price Adjustments:

Prevailing Wage rates may increase over the period of the Master Purchase Order. Therefore, vendor should propose a set dollar amount above current prevailing wage rates (e.g., PW=\$17/hr. price over \$10/hr. Total charge \$27/hr.). This should be referenced in the Notes section of Attachment B – Bid Item List. As prevailing wage rates change, this amount will remain constant throughout the life of the contract.

## 9. Airport Security:

It is a material requirement of this Contract that the Vendor shall comply with all rules, regulations, written policies, and authorized directives from the City and/or the Transportation Security Administration with respect to Airport security. The Vendor shall conduct all of its activities at the Airport in compliance with the Airport security program, which is administered by the Security Section of the Airport Operations Division, Department of Aviation. Violation by the Vendor or any of its employees, subcontractors, and vendors of any rule, regulation, or authorized directive from the City or the Transportation Security Administration with respect to Airport Security shall be grounds for immediate termination by the City of this Contract for cause.

The Vendor shall promptly upon notice of award of this Contract, meet with the Airport's Assistant Security Manager to establish badging and vehicle permit requirements for Vendor's operations under this Contract. The Vendor shall obtain the proper access authorizations for all of its employees, subcontractors, and vendors who will enter the Airport to perform work or make deliveries and shall be responsible for each such person's compliance with all Airport rules and regulations, including without limitation those pertaining to security. Any person who violates such rules may be subject to revocation of his/her access authorization. The failure of the Vendor or any subcontractor to complete any required services hereunder shall not be excused on account of the revocation for good cause of access authorization of any person.

The security status of the Airport is subject to change without notice. If the security status of the Airport changes at any time during the term of this Contract, the Vendor shall take immediate steps to comply with security modifications which occur as a result of the changed status. The Vendor may at any time obtain current information from the Airport Security Office regarding the Airport's security status in relation to the Vendor's operations at the Airport.

The Vendor shall return to the City at the expiration or termination of this Contract, or upon demand by the City, all access keys or access badges issued to it for any area of the Airport, whether or not restricted. If the Vendor fails to do so, the Consultant shall be liable to reimburse the City for all the City's costs for work required to prevent compromise of the Airport security system. The City may withhold funds in the amount of such costs from any amounts due and payable to the Vendor under this Contract.

## 10. Prevailing Wages:

Any Contract in the amount of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) or more arising out of this proposal shall be subject to the following provisions concerning prevailing wages.

- a. The minimum wages to be paid for every class of labor, mechanics and worker shall be not less than the scale of wages from time to time determined to be the prevailing wages.
- b. The Vendor or his/her subcontractor shall pay mechanics, laborers and workers employed directly upon the site of the work the full amounts accrued at time of payment, computed at wage rates not less than those stated or referenced in the specifications, and any addenda thereto, on the actual date of proposal opening, or in effect on the date of grant of permit for performance of such work under D.R.M.C. Section 49-171 et seq., or on the date of the written Purchase Order for contracts let by informal procedure under D.R.M.C. Section 20-63(b), regardless of any contractual relationship which may be alleged to exist between the vendor or subcontractor and such laborers, mechanics and workers.
- c. The vendor and subcontractors to pay all workers, mechanics, and other laborers at least once a week the full amounts of wages accrued at the time of payment except that the vendor and subcontractor shall make such payments to non-construction workers such as janitorial or custodial workers at least twice per month.
- d. The vendor shall post in a prominent and easily accessible place at the site of the work the scale of wages to be paid by the vendor and all subcontractors working under the vendor.
- e. If the vendor or any subcontractor shall fail to pay such wages as are required by the contract, the Auditor shall not approve any warrant or demand for payment to the vendor until the vendor furnishes the Auditor evidence satisfactory to the Auditor that such wages so required by the contract have been paid.
- f. The vendor shall furnish to the Auditor each week during which work is in progress under the contract, a true and correct copy of the payroll records of all workers, laborers and mechanics employed under the contract, either by the vendor or subcontractors.
- g. The copy of the payroll record shall be accompanied by a sworn statement of the vendor that the copy is a true and correct copy of the payroll records of all mechanics, laborers or other workers working under the contract either for the vendor or subcontractors, that payments were made to the workers, laborers and mechanics as set forth in the payroll records, that no deductions were made other than those set forth in such records, and that all workers, mechanics and other laborers employed on work under the contract, either by the vendor or by any subcontractor, have been paid the prevailing wages as set forth in the contract specifications.
- h. If any laborer, worker or mechanic employed by the vendor or any subcontractor under the contract has been or is being paid a rate of wages less than the rate of wages required by the contract to be paid as aforesaid, the City may, by written notice to the vendor, suspend or terminate the vendor's right to proceed with the work, or such part of the work as to which there has been a failure to pay the required wages, and in the event of termination may prosecute the work to completion by contract or otherwise, and the vendor and any sureties shall be liable to the City for any excess costs occasioned the City thereby.

The Vendor and every subcontractor under this contract shall:

- a. Pay every worker, mechanic and laborer employed under this purchase order or contract not less than the scale of wages as determined by the Career Service Board under subsection (c) of Section 20-76 of the Revised Municipal Code.
- b. Pay all workers, mechanics, and other laborers at least once a week the full amounts of wages accrued at the time of payment, computed at wage rates not less than those stated in the specifications.
- c. Post in a prominent and easily accessible place at the site of the work the scale of wages to be paid by the vendor and all subcontractors working under the vendor.

d. Furnish the Auditor each week during which work is in progress under the purchase order or contract, a true and correct copy of the payroll records of all workers, laborers and mechanics employed under the contract, either by the vendor or subcontractors. Such payroll records shall include information showing the number of hours worked by each worker, laborer or mechanic employed under the contract, the hourly pay of each such worker, laborer or mechanic, any deductions made from pay, and the net amount of pay received by each worker, laborer or mechanic for the period covered by the payroll. The payroll record shall be accompanied by a sworn statement of the vendor that the copy is a true and correct copy of the payroll records of all mechanics, laborers, or other workers working under the contract either for the vendor or subcontractors, that payments were made to the workers, laborers and mechanics as set forth in the payroll records, that no deductions were made other than those set forth in such records, and that all workers, mechanics and other laborers employed on work under the contract, either by the vendor or by any subcontractor have been paid the prevailing wages as set forth in the contract specifications.

If the vendor or any subcontractor shall fail to pay such wages as are required by the purchase order or contract, the Auditor shall not approve any warrant or demand for payment to the vendor until the vendor furnishes the Auditor evidence satisfactory to the Auditor that such wages so required by the purchase order or contract have been paid.

If any laborers, worker or mechanic employed by the vendor or any subcontractor under the purchase order or contract has been or is being paid a rate of wages less than the rate of wages required by the purchase order or contract to be paid as aforesaid, the City may, by written notice to the vendor, suspend or terminate the vendor's right to proceed with the work, or such part of the work as to which there has been a failure to pay the required wages and, in the event of termination, may prosecute the work to completion by contract or otherwise, and the vendor and any sureties shall be liable to the City for any excess costs occasioned the City thereby.

## 11. Cooperative Purchasing:

The City encourages and participates in cooperative purchasing endeavors undertaken by or on behalf of other governmental jurisdictions, pursuant to Denver Revised Municipal Code Sec. 20-64.5. To the extent other governmental jurisdictions are legally able to participate in cooperative purchasing endeavors, the City supports such cooperative activities. Further, it is a specific requirement of this proposal or Request for Proposal that pricing offered herein to the City may be offered by the vendor to any other governmental jurisdiction purchasing the same products.

The vendor(s) must deal directly with any governmental agency concerning the placement of purchase orders, freight charges for destinations outside of the Denver Metro area, contractual disputes, invoicing, and payment. The City shall not be liable for any costs, damages incurred by any other entity.

## 12. Vendor Performance Management:

Vendors are required to furnish a performance report to the buyer on an annual basis, no later than the anniversary date of the applicable Master Purchase Order or City Contract, providing at a minimum the following information:

- Total dollar value of purchases per City Agency
- Total number of transactions per City Agency
- Percentage of items shipped from local stock

- Percentage of items backordered
- Average delivery time for stock material
- Average delivery time for backorders

# **FOR SERVICES**

- Total dollar value of purchases per City Agency
- Total number of transactions per City Agency
- Average response time after receipt of call from the City
- Average time for job completion
