Mayor's Office of the National Western Center is responsible for construction of the campus, holds the lease and is the principal landowner. The NWC Authority is responsible for programming and maintaining the campus for the next 100 years. The Western Stock Show Association is building their own headquarters, the Legacy Building, and will continue to host the Stock Show, Denver County Fair and All-Star Rodeo. The CSU Spur campus is made up of 3 buildings focused on food, water and health and will be a hub for research related to important world issues and be open to the public as a place for experiential education.







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
