EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Background:

Since 2001 the City of Denver (City) has contracted with the Town of Morrison (Town) to provide water and sewer projects including wastewater remediation and treatment for Red Rocks Park and Amphitheatre. The Town is the only provider of these services with the infrastructure and capacity to handle and treat sewage at the volume produced from tourism and events held in the park and Amphitheatre.

Current Request:

DAV is seeking City Council approval of IGA THTRS-202262385 with the Town of Morrison (Town) that will allow up to \$7,000,000 to be spent through December 31, 2031 for treatment of wastewater generated by Red Rocks Park and Amphitheatre. Prominent items include:

- The Town is the only entity with the infrastructure to process and treat sewage and wastewater from Red Rocks Park and Amphitheatre and repatriate discharge to the Bear Creek basin.
- The Town will test discharge to ensure it complies with all Federal and State requirements.
- The City may purchase additional taps for processing of additional wastewater should the need arise.
- The City will be responsible for repair and replacement of City Wastewater Facilities upstream of the comminutors, as is necessary for the City Wastewater Facilities to operate in good working order.
- The Town will maintain and operate the City Wastewater Facilities beginning with, and including the comminutors located on City's property, and all downstream wastewater infrastructure, but not limited to pumps, manholes, flow meters, and sample meters, to ensure they are in good condition and working order.
