Dear City Council Members:

Although I cannot comment specifically on Pepsi's plans to construct a new beverage manufacturing plant in the High Point development, I write on behalf of our organization to express our support for Pepsi and its role in the community here in Denver.

The Colorado Hispanic Chamber of Commerce (COHCC) is the State's largest minority chamber, representing over 2,500 members directly throughout the State and more than 120,000 Hispanic-owned businesses in Colorado. Our goals are centered around building a prosperous community through creating economic opportunities for minority-owned businesses.

After serving as the President and CEO of the Colorado Hispanic Chamber of Commerce for over five years, Pepsi is always at the top of the list when I think of great corporate partners. Pepsi, Shawn Early, and their entire team have provided significant financial, in-kind, and staff support. He is a brief list of the highlights of their support.
