14	WHEREAS, as required by Article X, Sec. 20(3) of the Colorado Constitution (TABOR), ir			
15	advance of the 2020 election the city mailed to all registered electors a notice of the election including			
16	an estimate of the first full fiscal year maximum dollar amount; and			
17	WHEREAS, the total actual dollar amount of the first full year revenue collected in 2021			
18	exceeded the estimate provided to the voters in the 2020 TABOR notice; and			
19	WHEREAS, Article X, Sec. 20(3) of TABOR states, "Except by later voter approval, if	a tax		
20	increase or fiscal year spending exceed any estimatefor the same fiscal year, the tax increase is

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12 The proper officials of the City and County of Denver as are charged with the duties relating to the 13 election shall, before the election, issue such calls, make such certifications, and publications, give 14 such notices (including, without limitation, the notice required by Article X, Section 20(3)(b) of the 15 Colorado Constitution), make such appointments, and do all such other acts and things in connection 16 with the submission of this question to the registered electors of the City and County of Denver at 17 the election as are required by the constitution and laws of the state of Colorado and the Charter 18 and ordinances of the City and County of Denver. The ballots cast at such election shall be 19 canvassed and the results ascertained, determined, and certified in accordance with the 20 requirements of the Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado and the Charter and ordinances 21 of the City and County of Denver.
