- Subaward Program Administrator: NEWSED Community Development Corporation
- Term: 2022-2023
- Amount: \$2,150,000
- Service: Activation in NEST & Denver Recovery Index Map neighborhoods
  - Events and beautification projects
    - Drive commercial foot traffic
    - Foster community capacity building in collaboration
    - Connect the community within their geography
    - Encourage community members to eat/shop locally boosting small business revenue

## Neighborhood Activation Program – ARPA

- Grants between \$20,000 \$200,000
  - Events or Beautification projects that drive increased foot traffic and economic activity in business corridors
    - Neighborhood Activation Events: any events, workshops, performances, walking tours, festivals, community engagement activities, etc.
    - Neighborhood Activation Beautification Projects: any placemaking or physical improvements such as public art exhibitions, landscaping, business wayfinding, banners, decorations, accessibility improvements, etc.



## Neighborhood Activation Program - ARPA

#### Eligibility

- Who can apply?
  - Community groups (with fiscal sponsors), nonprofit organizations, and businesses
  - Located in NEST neighborhoods and surrounding areas as defined by the Denver Neighborhood Recovery Index Map
- How will proposed projects be prioritized?
  - Implemented in NEST neighborhoods and surrounding areas as defined by the Denver Neighborhood Recovery Index Map
  - Activation of business corridors is highly desired
  - Projects that center marginalized communities + equity considerations
  - Projects that benefit the corridor/area, as opposed to only benefitting a single entity
