1	Section 1. Article III of Chapter 45 shall be amended by adding the language underlined		
2	and deleting the language stricken to read as follows:

4	(b) "Secondhand property" means the following items of tangible personal property sold or		
15	traded by a secondhand dealer:		
16	(7) Auto accessories, including, but not limited to, wheels, and hub caps, and catalytic		
7	converters, but not including core charges for automobile parts which are not rebuilt on the		
8	premises; and		
9	Sec. 45-69. – Dealers to exhibit and report goods to police.		
20	In addition to any other acts prohibited by this chapter, it shall be unlawful for any secondhand		
21	dealer, automobile parts recycler, junk dealer, or operator of a junk wagon to violate any of the		
22	provisions of this section:		
23	(a) Upon demand by any officer of Denver Police Department, any Every secondhand dealer,		
24	automobile parts recycler, or junk dealer, or operator of a junk wagon who shall receive or be in		
25	possession of possesses any good(s) or article(s) which may have been lost or stolen or are alleged		
26	or supposed to have been lost or stolen shall-forthwith immediately produce and exhibit the good(s		
27	or article(s) to the officer-same to any member of the Denver Police Department upon demand.		
28	(b) Any secondhand dealer, automobile parts recycler, junk dealer, or operator of a jun		
29	wagon who receives a catalytic converter shall notify the Denver Police Department within one (1		
30	business day of such receipt. Such notice shall be provided in a manner established or approved		
31	by the manager of safety or the manager's duly authorized representative. At a minimum, such		
32	notice shall include a photograph of the catalytic converter and a record, photograph, or copy of a		
33	valid government-issued form of photo identification for the person who supplied or delivered the		

catalytic converter to the dealer.				
Section 2. Division 1 of Article VI of Chapter 45 shall be amended by adding the language				
underlined and deleting the language stricken to read as follows:				
Sec. 45-146. –Failure to exhibit or record identification.				
In addition to any other acts prohibited by this chapter, it shall be unlawful for any person to				
violate any of the provisions of this section when selling, trading, delivering, providing, or receiving				
a catalytic converter to a secondhand dealer, automobile parts recycler, junk dealer, or operator o				
a junk wagon ("dealer"):				
(1) The person must first present a valid government-issued form of photo identification to				
the dealer receiving the catalytic converter.				
(2) When receiving a catalytic converter from any person, the dealer must require and inspec				
a valid government-issued form of photo identification from the person.				
(3) When receiving a catalytic converter from any person, the dealer must record the following				
information: the name, address, and date of birth of the person and the identification number from				
the identification presented; the date, time, and place of the transaction; and an accurate description				
of the catalytic converter, including but not limited to any identification number, serial number, mode				
number, brand name, or other identifying marks.
