Denver Public Safety Youth Programs was awarded the Colorado Youth Detention Continuum grant to perform detention screening and pre-trial release services for youth in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Judicial District. This is a five-year grant which renews annually, and this request is to increase funding for the 2023 fiscal year. The additional funding comes from a Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) fund provided by the state. For the 2<sup>nd</sup> JD, COLA funds are used to increase services such as therapeutic support, trauma focused behavioral health, and family therapy for youth referred to Pretrial. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Judicial District Juvenile Services Planning Committee serves as the advisory body for the program and has approved the extension of the original contract to a sixth year.

#### Scope of work:

Established thru Senate Bill 91-94, the Colorado Youth Detention Continuum (CYDC) program provides funding to jurisdictions to implement alternatives to incarceration for youth. CYDC program staff are responsible for screening youth who have been charged with a misdemeanor and/or felony offense to determine release disposition and providing pre-trial release services which allows the youth to be supervised in the community in lieu of remaining in detention while the case proceeds through the juvenile justice system. As part of the Pretrial release program, CYDC program staff provide screening/assessment, case planning, supervision (including electronic home monitoring), and case coordination services to support the youth and family while the youth goes through the adjudication process.

Savio House provide family/individual therapeutic interventions such as Multi-Systemic Therapy and Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy. Seeing Our Adolescents Rise (SOAR) provides mentoring and academic support services; Success 4 Life provides tutoring services; Fully Liberated Youth (FLY) provides mentoring and therapeutic services; Resolute Youth Services provide individual/family/group therapy, substance use and mental health evaluations and parent coaching.
