  Foundation shall be admitted without charge.

22	d. Consumer price index adjustment. On or about March 1, 2024, and annually		
23	thereafter with a final adjustment on or about March 1, 2029, and approval from the		
24	Manager of Parks and Recreation, the fees and charges set out in this subsection (3) of		
25	section 39-121 of the Denver Revised Municipal Code (as amended from time to time) may		
26	be adjusted, in an amount equal to the percentage change from the previous year in the		
27	CPI-U (rounded to the nearest dollar), up to a maximum increase of five (5) percent. The		
28	adjustments will be reflected in a fee and charge schedule issued by the Denver Zoo and		
29	made publicly available in advance of the fees and charges becoming effective. The		
30	percentage change to be applied to the rates shall be calculated as follows:		
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1	CPI for current period, Less CPI for previous period:
2	Equals index point change
3	Divided by previous period CPI
4	Equals result multiplied by 100
5	Equals percent change.

7	<u>CPI-U means the United States Department of Labor Statistics (Bureau of Labor Statistics)</u>
8	Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers. All items, for the Denver-Aurora-

10	<u>substantially changed, re-named, or abandoned by the United States Government, then in</u>
11	its place shall be substituted the index established by the United States Government that
