BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. Section 39-121 of the Denver Revised Municipal Code is amended by revising subsection (3) to read as follows:

(3) City park zoo fees:

a. Regular fees; single admission:

		March through October	November through February
1.	12 16 years and over (other than senior citizens)	\$20.00 \$24.00	\$15.00
2.	3 years to 11 15 years, and accompanied by parent or other adult	14.00 - <u>18.00</u>	10.00

5.	Denver Zoological Foundation members	No Charge	No Charge

b. Special days, rates and conditions: The manager of parks and recreation shall designate not less than seven (7) days in each calendar year during which no admission will be charged to residents of the state, and may establish rates or conditions for groups or special parties, and may charge additional rates for groups or special parties from outside of the city. Current members of the Denver Zoological Foundation shall be admitted without charge.

The manager of parks and recreation may also establish rates for business-sponsored periods, including evenings, for the Denver Zoo.

c. Zoo facility fees: <u>maximum rate charges for use of Zoo facilities which may be discounted by Denver Zoo:</u>

20	Section 2. Section 39-121 of the Denver Revised Municipal Code is amended by adding a		
21	subsection (3)(d) to read as follows:		
22	d. Consumer price index adjustment. On or about March 1, 2024, and annually		
23	thereafter with a final adjustment on or about March 1, 2029, and approval from the		
24	Manager of Parks and Recreation, the fees and charges set out in this subsection (3) of		
25	section 39-121 of the Denver Revised Municipal Code (as amended from time to time) may		
26	be adjusted, in an amount equal to the percentage change from the previous year in the		
27	CPI-U (rounded to the nearest dollar), up to a maximum increase of five (5) percent. The		
28	adjustments will be reflected in a fee and charge schedule issued by the Denver Zoo and		
29	made publicly available in advance of the fees and charges becoming effective. The		
30	percentage change to be applied to the rates shall be calculated as follows:		

1	CPI for current period, Less CPI for previous period:
2	Equals index point change
3	Divided by previous period CPI
4	Equals result multiplied by 100
5	Equals percent change.
6	
7	CPI-U means the United States Department of Labor Statistics (Bureau of Labor Statistics)
8	Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers. All items, for the Denver-Aurora-
9	Lakewood, Colorado metropolitan area (1982-84-100). In the event that the CPI-U is
10	substantially changed, re-named, or abandoned by the United States Government, then in
11	its place shall be substituted the index established by the United States Government that
12	most closely resembles the CPI-U.
