9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:		
10	Section 1. Section 32-75 of Article II of Chapter 32 shall be repealed and reenacted to read		
11	as follows:		
12	Sec. 32-75. – Food and food handlers.		
13	(a) Food processing, wholesale, and warehouse establishments. Food processing,		
14	wholesale, and warehouse establishments shall pay the following fees:		
15	(1) Application fee \$150.00		
16	(2) License fee \$150.00		
17	(3) Food processing, wholesale, and warehouse establishments conducting activities		
18	identified in the categories of this paragraph (3) may conduct secondary retail sales of food products		
19	in that same category at the same location.		
20	(i) Basic license (packaged, bottled, and canned)

30	Outlet for purposes of this sub-section (d) shall mean a separate and distinct food

- service" is provided by such restaurant and no seating is provided inside the restaurant .....200.00 (f) Restaurant-type operation located on premises where the primary business is not the operation of a restaurant, including the offering for sale of food or drink for consumption on or off the premises, stand-up counters, prepared food items sold with the aid of a pushcart, wagon, carriage or vehicle of any kind or description, and similar food or drink sellers who do not provide seating arrangements for patrons .....125.00
- 7 (3) Temporary retail food establishment license fees, per year, shall be one hundred dollars
  8 (\$100.00) plus ten dollars (\$10.00) per day for the first five (5) days of each event. Temporary retail
  9 food establishments shall not pay application fees.
- 10 (4) Food peddlers license, per year, shall be fifty dollars (\$50.00) per year. Food peddlers
   11 shall pay a twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) application fee.
- 12 (5) Ice cream vendor's license fees, in addition to applicable mobile food unit and pushcart
   13 fees, shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per year with a fifty-dollar (\$50.00) application fee.

14 (6) Other retail food establishment license fees, per year. The number of employees 15 considered for the determination of the appropriate license category shall be the full-time equivalent 16 number of employees directly related to the processing, storing, handling or packaging of food 17 intended for human consumption. The manager of public health and environment shall certify to the 18 department of excise and licenses the kinds and types of activities permissible under each license 19 category, taking into account the number of full-time equivalent employees utilized in the operation.
