7	<u>A RESOLUTION</u>		
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9	Extending the declaration of local disaster emergency pertaining to sheltering		
10	of migrants and asylum seekers filed with the clerk and recorder to February		
11	27, 2023.		
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13	WHEREAS, over the past four months, the City and County of Denver (City) has seen a		
14	steady influx of approximately 3,700 migrants and asylum seekers arrive in the City without having		
15	any immediate plans for shelter;		
16	WHEREAS, this dramatic recent increase in the influx of migrants seeking shelter and asylum		
17	from foreign countries has significantly increased the need to provide shelter, transportation, food		
18	and services, basic health and first aid needs, COVID-19 testing and associated medical care		
19	needed during quarantine and isolation and other supportive services within the State of Colorado		
20	and specifically within the City;		
21	WHEREAS, many of the migrants and asylum seekers are coping with the effects of trauma		
22	and exhaustion, as well as other physical and mental health concerns;		
23	WHEREAS, to accommodate the recent increase in migrants and asylum seekers arriving in		
24	the City, the City has closed programming in one recreation center to utilize the space for shelter		
25	and services, and is evaluating other spaces that may be used to accommodate additional persons		
26	as needed;		
27	WHEREAS, the City forecasts dangerously low freezing temperatures in January and		
28	February, along with other inclement weather, such as snow and strong winds;		
29	WHEREAS, the sudden increase in need to provide shelter, transportation, food and services,		
30 21	basic health and first aid needs, COVID-19 testing and associated medical care needed during		
31	quarantine and isolation and other supportive services is straining and exceeding current City		
32	resources;		

WHEREAS, if migrants and asylum seekers continue to enter the City at, near, or more than
 the current rate, the City's capacity to shelter and care for such persons will suffer additional strain
 and continue to exceed the City's capacity;

WHEREAS, the City now faces an unprecedented humanitarian crisis that requires it to take
extraordinary measures to meet the immediate needs of the asylum seekers;

6 WHEREAS, the City has requested financial and other assistance from the state government
7 as well as nonprofits and other community resources, including additional sheltering, food,
8 transportation, and services;

9 WHEREAS, the City anticipates requesting financial and other assistance from the federal10 government;

WHEREAS, people and property are at risk based on the arrival of significant numbers of
 migrants and individuals and families seeking asylum, as described in the above paragraphs;

WHEREAS, the risks posed as described herein require preparation and arrangements for
 food, shelter, transportation, infrastructure, and other humanitarian aid to protect the health, safety,
 or welfare of people within the City described herein.

WHEREAS, on December 15, 2022, Mayor Hancock filed with the City and County of
Denver Clerk and Recorder a State of Local Disaster Emergency Declaration (hereinafter
"Declaration");

WHEREAS, the period of Declaration is currently in effect until Tuesday, January 17, 2023;

20 **WHEREAS,** pursuant to state law, Colo. Rev. Stat. §24-33.5-709(1), the effect of the period 21 of local disaster emergency cannot exceed seven days except by or with the approval of City 22 Council:

23 WHEREAS, out of an abundance of caution, City Council intends to further extend the 24 current Declaration until Monday, February 27, 2023;

WHEREAS, the Declaration gives the City the ability to expedite procurement for critical services and shelter for migrants and asylum seekers in the City and continuing to arrive in the City, among other time-sensitive needs.

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29 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

30 Section 1. That the State of Local Disaster Emergency Declaration prepared by Mayor 31 Michael B. Hancock and filed with the Clerk and Recorder of the City and County of Denver on 32 December 15, 2022, be extended until February 27, 2023, and shall be in effect until terminated by 33 the Mayor or by City Council in accordance with state and local laws.
