- Expanded the department by 5 new positions (a 27% increase), and filled 6 vacant positions within 8 months.
- Separated 4 program/positions from 2 co-mingled programs/positions, including securing funding, and grantor (SAMHSA) approval and support.
- Wrote grant applications, Letters of Intent and a City of Flagstaff CDBG (Community Development Block Grant) application proposal as well as a City of Flagstaff Proposal for Public Safety Alternative Response for a total request of over \$615,000.
 Unsolicited funding request to Arizona Governor's office was funded at \$300,000 to fund the Kinlani Shadehouse Resource Center.
- Served on 3 committees: Coconino County Continuum of Care Executive Committee, City of Flagstaff Housing and Health Commission, and the County's Supportive Services Network.
