Resolution 23-0106: Approves a grant agreement with the United States Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance, Office of Justice Programs for \$512,118 and through 09-30-2025 for the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant, to cover the subscription cost related to an existing ShotSpotter location, funding for the District Attorney's Office to hire staff in support their restitution unit, and other programs, such as providing free license plate screws to the public, citywide (POLIC-202266272-00).

An average of 87.1% of ShotSpotter alerts from 2019-2022 had no correlating 911 call.

- \$308,160 Supports the ShotSpotter contract for approximately 3.6 square miles of coverage (of approximately 14 sq. miles)
- This is not an expansion of ShotSpotter; rather, the grant funds will continue the current geographic coverage
- Consistent with previous years' awards
