

CARGO AIRLINE USE AND LEASE AGREEMENTS

OVERVIEW

DEN's Cargo Airlines' Use and Lease Agreements have reached the end of their term. DEN, along with our Cargo Airlines, has agreed to start a new agreement, with no changes to the current business terms, offering a new 5-year Use and Lease Agreement. These agreements would commence on March 1, 2023. Three of these cargo airlines lease buildings at Denver International Airport: Federal Express Corporation, United Parcel Service Co. (UPS) and DHL Express (USA), Inc. The remaining airlines do not lease space and operate either as affiliates, supporting the three larger Cargo Airlines, or on behalf of Amazon Air. The carriers flying on behalf of Amazon Air currently are, Air Transport International (ATI) and Airborne Express (ABX).

CARGO AT DEN

Denver International Airport is a leader when it comes to the ability to move and handle large volumes of air cargo, making the airport an asset to companies that require steady and reliable shipments of materials and components from overseas. DEN is home to several world-class cargo movers and support facilities, including DHL, UPS and FedEx, as well as several carriers flying for Amazon Air. Further development of cargo operations is a strategic objective for DEN, identified in the Vision 100 pillar, Expanding Global Connections. As Denver grows as a city, our Cargo Carriers support that economic growth through the arriving and departing commodities, businesses in our community need.
