


Types of Opioids

- Prescription
- Illicit
- Fentanyl
- Novel psychoactive substances (NPS)







Opioid Side Effects

Most Common:

- Constipation
- Nausea

Other Possible Side Effects:


- Dizziness
- Vomiting
- Physical dependance
- Tolerance

Most Dangerous:

- Respiratory depression
- Sedation



How do Opioid Overdoses Happen?



Quantity or strength of opioids gradually suppress the involuntary drive to breathe

Breathing slows down


Heart Stops



Naloxone (NARCAN®)

- Only function is to reverse an opioid overdose
- Safe: zero effect if opioids are not present
- Available as nasal spray or intramuscular injection
- No known negative effects
- May put opioid dependent person in withdrawal
- No potential for misuse or dependence





Not Opioids

Therefore

Not Naloxone

- Methamphetamine
- Xylazine
- Cocaine
- Ecstasy
- Ketamine

- LSD
- Psychedelic mushrooms
- Marijuana/THC/cannabinoids
- Kratom (mitragynine)



Signs of Opioid Overdose: Medical Examiner Data

Scene findings (manner of death)

- Pressed pills
- Burnt foil +/- pill residue
- Needles
- Lighters/torches
- Paraphernalia in hand
- Plume of fluid at external airways
- Body positioning


Autopsy findings (cause of death)

- Track marks or scars
- Plume of fluid at external airways
- Severe pulmonary edema
- Constipated stool
- Increased right ventricular wall thickness
- Pulmonary arterial atherosclerosis
- Toxicology results





Microscopic Findings in Lungs



- Polarizable crystals
- Features of pulmonary hypertension






Age-Adjusted Overdose Death Rates Involving Select Substances: Colorado Residents 2017-2021




Counts of Drug Overdose Deaths involving Fentanyl by County of Residence, 2017-2021



<u>Colorado</u> Age Adjusted Rate of Drug Overdose Deaths involving Fentanyl (5 year): **6.46 deaths per 100,000** (95% CI: 6.16-6.76) <u>Denver Age Adjusted Rate of Drug Overdose Deaths involving Fentanyl (5 year)</u>: **11.77 deaths per 100,000** (95% CI:10.66-12.88)







Percent of fentanyl deaths by number of substances contributing to death, 2022




Fentanyl Deaths with Other Substances, 2022




2022 Fentanyl Deaths by Manner of Death and Location:








Demographics of Overdose Deaths Due to Fentanyl



Denver Drug Deaths Due to Fentanyl by Month and Year of Death














Myths About Fentanyl Can:
