7 8 9 10	Extending the declaration of local disaster emergency pertaining to sheltering of migrants and asylum seekers filed with the clerk and recorder to April 24, 2023.						
11	WHEREAS, over the past five months, the City and County of Denver (City) has seen						
12	steady influx of approximately 5,600 migrants and asylum seekers arrive in the City without having						
13	any immediate plans for shelter;						
14	WHEREAS, this dramatic recent increase in the influx of migrants seeking shelter and asylur						
15	from foreign countries has significantly increased the need to provide shelter, transportation, foo						
16	and services, basic health and first aid needs, COVID-19 testing and associated medical car						
17	needed during quarantine and isolation and other supportive services within the State of Colorad						
18	and specifically within the City;						
19	WHEREAS, many of the migrants and asylum seekers are coping with the effects of traum						
20	and exhaustion, as well as other physical and mental health concerns;						
21	WHEREAS, to accommodate the recent increase in migrants and asylum seekers arriving i						
22	the City, the City has closed programming in one recreation center to utilize the space for shelter						
23	and services, and is evaluating other spaces that may be used to accommodate additional persons						
24	as needed;						
25	WHEREAS, the sudden increase in need to provide shelter, transportation, food and services						
26	basic health and first aid needs, COVID-19 testing and associated medical care needed durin						
27	quarantine and isolation and other supportive services is straining and exceeding current Cit						
28	resources;						
29	WHEREAS, if migrants and asylum seekers continue to enter the City at, near, or more that						
30	the current rate, the City's capacity to shelter and care for such persons will suffer additional strai						
31	and continue to exceed the City's capacity;						
32	WHEREAS, the City now faces an unprecedented humanitarian crisis that requires it to tak						
33	extraordinary measures to meet the immediate needs of the asylum seekers;						

WHEREAS, the City has requested financial and other assistance from the state government
as well as nonprofits and other community resources, including additional sheltering, food,
transportation, and services;

4 **WHEREAS**, the City has requested financial and other assistance from the federal 5 government;

6 **WHEREAS**, people and property are at risk based on the arrival of significant numbers of 7 migrants and individuals and families seeking asylum, as described in the above paragraphs;

8 **WHEREAS**, the risks posed as described herein require preparation and arrangements for 9 food, shelter, transportation, infrastructure, and other humanitarian aid to protect the health, safety, 10 or welfare of people within the City described herein.

11 **WHEREAS**, on December 15, 2022, Mayor Hancock filed with the City and County of 12 Denver Clerk and Recorder a State of Local Disaster Emergency Declaration (hereinafter 13 "Declaration");

14 **WHEREAS**, the period of Declaration is currently in effect until Monday, March 27, 2023;

WHEREAS, pursuant to state law, Colo. Rev. Stat. §24-33.5-709(1), the effect of the period
of local disaster emergency cannot exceed seven days except by or with the approval of City
Council;

18 **WHEREAS,** out of an abundance of caution, City Council intends to further extend the 19 current Declaration until Monday, April 24, 2023;

20 **WHEREAS**, the Declaration gives the City the ability to expedite procurement for critical 21 services and shelter for migrants and asylum seekers in the City and continuing to arrive in the 22 City, among other time-sensitive needs.

24 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. That the State of Local Disaster Emergency Declaration prepared by Mayor Michael B. Hancock and filed with the Clerk and Recorder of the City and County of Denver on December 15, 2022, be extended until April 24, 2023, and shall be in effect until terminated by the Mayor or by City Council in accordance with state and local laws.
