BR23-0552: Amends Chapter 17 of the Denver Revised Municipal Code to establish a licensing program for secure transportation services, pursuant to HB21-1085

Background

- In 2021, the Colorado General Assembly passed <u>HB 21-1085</u>, requiring local jurisdictions to create and administer a new type of license for the transport of individuals suffering from a behavioral health crisis.
- The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment adopted <u>rules</u> to supplement the bill in 2022.





What is secure transport?

The bill creates a
trauma-informed
alternative
to traditional
emergency
transportation

- "Secure transportation" means urgent transportation services provided to individuals experiencing a behavioral health crisis.
- "Behavioral health crisis" means a significant disruption in a person's mental or emotional stability or functioning resulting in an urgent need for immediate assessment and treatment to prevent a further or serious deterioration in the person's mental or physical health.



What is NOT considered secure transport?

- × Traditional ambulance services
- Ubers, Lyfts, and public transportation that patients use to travel to mental health appointments
- Emergency transportation provided by law enforcement and law enforcement contractors



Counties' Statutory Obligations

Ensure compliance with minimum standards and license all secure transportation services

Set fees for all licenses, vehicle permits and renewals

Issue separate vehicle permits for each vehicle being used by the secure transportation service

Develop and implement written complaint and investigation policy

Develop and implement process for denial, suspension or revocation of a license or vehicle permit



Why are we here?

- In order to comply with the state mandate, Denver must create this new license in ordinance.
- Most of the requirements for the license are in state law and rule, though we are also proposing a few extra features in line with the goals of the state law, such as background checks for drivers.



Licensing Details

Companies (Three-year license)


- Companies must comply with state-mandated requirements for hiring and standard operating procedures.
- State law divides companies into *two classes*: those who use physical restraint and those that do not.

Vehicles (Annual license)

- Any vehicle used to pick up patients in Denver must be permitted.
- Vehicle permits will only be issued to Secure Transport Companies.
- Vehicles must meet state-mandated inspection requirements.
- State law divides vehicles into two types: those that have a safety partition and those that do not.

Drivers (Annual license)

- Drivers may work for any number of Secure Transport Companies and drive any of the company's vehicles.
- If a driver is picking up patients in Denver, they must be licensed in Denver.





Licensing Details

Transferability

•None of the licenses are transferrable.

Application Requirements

- Applicants must provide written policies, procedures, and standard operating procedures.
- Applicants must include inspection reports and proof of insurance coverage for all vehicles.
- Drivers must complete a background check.

Inspections

- •Companies' policies and procedures must be inspected every three years.
- Vehicles must be inspected annually for mechanical safety, as well as equipment safety.

Causes for Denial

- •Noncompliance with state Secure Transport laws or rules
- Noncompliance with local laws or rules, including violations of Chapters 17 and 32
- •The applicant has been convicted of a felony of moral turpitude and has not been sufficiently rehabilitated

Unlawful Acts

- Operating without a license
- •Transporting more than one patient at a time
- Possessing weapons while performing secure transport services
- •Interfering with investigations of a secure transportation service
- Noncompliance with any laws or rules relating to Secure Transport




