14	WHEREAS, Ordinance Number 0804, Series 2022, authorized the Denver Preschool	
15	Program to utilize potential state resources separate and apart from the voter-approved sales	
16	and use tax increase to expand its capabilities and increase access to, and the quality of,	
17	preschool programs for Denver residents; and	
18	WHEREAS, the purpose of this ordinance is to authorize the Denver Preschool Program	
19	to use resources separate and apart from the voter-approved sales and use tax to support	
20	preschool programs for non-Denver residents.

22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:	
23	Section 1. Chapter 11, article III, D.R.M.C. shall be amended by adding the languag	е

27	(b) Any non-profit corporation with which the city may contract pursuant to this article sha	ıII
28	meet the following criteria and requirements:	
29	(2) The purpose of the corporation as reflected in the corporation's articles of incorporatio	
30	shall be to administer the Denver preschool program under contract with the city in accordance wit	
31	the requirements of this article and all applicable laws. The corporation may also administer other	
32	preschool programs benefiting early childhood education programs and services for Denver residents	
33	or perform other services, only so long as such programs or services to not conflict with any provisio	
34	of article III of chapter 11, or conflict with any agreement between the city and the corporation. For	
25	nurnoses of this section "preschool programs" means any early care or education program for childre	n

from birth through kindergarten enrollment.

Sec. 11-22. - Program requirements to be included in contract.

Any contract between the city and a non-profit corporation for disbursement of the Denver preschool tax revenues shall include the following provisions and requirements:

- (4<u>a</u>) Any expenditure of Denver preschool tax revenues under the contract shall be subject to annual appropriation by the city council and shall be limited to preschool programs benefiting early childhood education programs and services for Denver residents.
- (2b) No more than seven (7) percent of the Denver preschool tax revenue received by the corporation in any year shall be spent on administrative expenses. For purposes of this limitation, "administrative expenses" shall mean salaries and office expense related to any staff or employees of the corporation; any expenses reimbursed to members of the board of directors or the board of advisors; routine business expenses such as insurance, accounting and legal expenses; and any similar overhead expenses incurred by the corporation. The term "administrative expenses" shall not be deemed to include any fees or expenses paid to third-party contractors or consultants to assist in the development or administration of the Denver preschool program.
- (3c) At least ninety-three (93) percent of Denver preschool tax revenue received by the corporation in any year shall be used for the following purposes only:
- ($\frac{1}{2}$) Tuition credits administered in accordance with the requirements of subsection ($4\underline{d}$) of this section.
- (<u>ii2</u>) Outreach to parents and the Denver community and assistance with enrollment in preschools.
- (iii3) Technical assistance and direct grants to preschool providers meeting the requirements of subsection ($\underline{5e}$) of this section, for the purpose of improving the quality of pre-school programs and services.
- (<u>iv4</u>) Contracting with qualified experts to design and assist with the implementation of a quality improvement system for preschools, including an objective quality rating system for preschools.
- (± 5) Measurement of the performance of the Denver preschool program and the preparation of reports to city officials and to the public on the performance of the program.
- (6) Grants and technical assistance to individuals and organizations seeking to obtain licensure to provide preschool care or education programs or services in Denver.
- (4<u>d</u>) Tuition credits funded pursuant to the Denver preschool program shall comply with the following standards and requirements:
- (<u>5e</u>) In order to be qualified for the use of tuition credits and for the receipt of technical assistance or direct grants, a preschool provider shall meet the following minimum requirements:

2	the auditor, and the public the following information:
3	(7g) Disbursement and use of the Denver preschool tax revenues shall be limited to the use
4	set forth in article III, chapter 11.
5	(8h) In administering the Denver preschool program or expending any monies derived from
6	the Denver preschool tax, the corporation shall not discriminate against any person on the basis
7	race, color, religion, national origin, gender, age (except as to the age of children qualifying for tuition
8	credits), military status, sexual orientation, gender variance, marital status, protective hairstyle, o
