12	steady influx of over 11,200 migrants and asylum seeke	ers arrive in the City without having any			
13	immediate plans for shelter;				
14	WHEREAS, this dramatic recent increase in the influ	x of migrants seeking shelter and asylum			
15	from foreign countries has significantly increased the nee	ed to provide shelter, transportation, food			
16	and services, basic health and first aid needs, COVID-	19 testing and associated medical care			
17	needed during quarantine and isolation and other suppor	tive services within the State of Colorado			
18	and specifically within the City;				
19	WHEREAS, many of the migrants and asylum seek	ers are coping with the effects of trauma			
20	and exhaustion, as well as other physical and mental heal	th concerns;			
21	WHEREAS, to accommodate the recent increase in	migrants and asylum seekers arriving in			
22	the City, the City is working with partner organization	s to establish spaces to accommodate			
23	migrants arriving in Denver in order to provide emergency	shelter and other services;			
24	WHEREAS, the sudden increase in need to provide	shelter, transportation, food and services,			
25	basic health and first aid needs, and other supportive se	rvices is straining and exceeding current			
26	City resources;				
27	WHEREAS, if migrants and asylum seekers continu	e to enter the City at, near, or more than			
28	the current rate, the City's capacity to shelter and care for	r such persons will suffer additional strain			
29	and continue to exceed the City's capacity;				
30	WHEREAS, the City now faces a humanitarian cri	sis that requires it to take extraordinary			
31	measures to meet the immediate needs of the asylum see	ekers;			
32	WHEREAS, the City has requested financial and oth	ner assistance from the state government			
33	as well as nonprofits and other community resources	s, including additional sheltering, food,			
34	transportation, and services;				

1 **WHEREAS,** the City has requested financial and other assistance from the federal 2 government;

WHEREAS, people and property are at risk based on the arrival of significant numbers of
migrants and individuals and families seeking asylum, as described in the above paragraphs;

WHEREAS, the risks posed as described herein require preparation and arrangements for
food, shelter, transportation, infrastructure, and other humanitarian aid to protect the health, safety,
or welfare of people within the City described herein.

8 WHEREAS, on December 15, 2022, Mayor Hancock filed with the City and County of Denver
9 Clerk and Recorder a State of Local Disaster Emergency Declaration (hereinafter "Declaration");

10 **WHEREAS**, the period of Declaration is currently in effect until Monday June 26, 2023;

11 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to state law, Colo. Rev. Stat. §24-33.5-709(1), the effect of the period of 12 local disaster emergency cannot exceed seven days except by or with the approval of City Council;

WHEREAS, out of an abundance of caution, City Council intends to further extend the current
Declaration until Monday, August 21, 2023;

WHEREAS, the Declaration gives the City the ability to expedite procurement for critical services and shelter for migrants and asylum seekers in the City and continuing to arrive in the City, among other time-sensitive needs.

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19 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. That the State of Local Disaster Emergency Declaration prepared by Mayor Michael B. Hancock and filed with the Clerk and Recorder of the City and County of Denver on December 15, 2022, be extended until August 21, 2023, and shall be in effect until terminated by the Mayor or by City Council in accordance with state and local laws.
