8 9 10	For an ordinance repealing and reenacting Division 5 of Article VIII of Chapter 2 of the Revised Municipal Code concerning a City-School Coordinating Committee.
11	WHEREAS, the City and County of Denver (the "City") and School District No. 1 have
12	long been active partners in serving Denver residents;
13	WHEREAS, factors and conditions both inside and outside of school impact issues
14	facing Denver residents including youth violence, childhood health, family stability, and
15	community wellbeing;
16	WHEREAS, the City recognizes and acknowledges that Article 20, Section 7 of the
17	Colorado Constitution grants exclusive control of the conduct, affairs, and business of School
18	District No.1 to its Board of Education;
19	WHEREAS, nothing in this ordinance is intended to conflict with or supersede the
20	requirements, duties, powers, or authority of the School District No. 1. Board of Education or its
21	Superintendent, or otherwise dictate education policy or district policy;
22	WHEREAS, this City and School District No. 1 have entered into various contracts to
23	jointly administer programs using city and school funding and facilities, including the Health
24	Food for Denver's Kids Initiative, the Denver Great Kids Head Start program, and the City's
25	Youth Violence Prevention Plan; and
26	WHEREAS, the City seeks to formalize its commitment to collaborate with School
27	District No. 1. in serving Denver residents.
28	
29	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:
30	Section 1. That Division 5, Article VIII, Section 2, D.R.M.C., is hereby repealed in its entirety
31	and the section is amended by re-enacting a new Division 5 to read as follows:

33	DIVISION 5 CITY-SCHOOL COORDINATING COMMITTEE

1 Sec. 2-229. - Legislative intent.

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2	The council hereby declares the legislative intent of this division is to achieve the most effectiv			
3	possible coordination and utilization of all resources of the city and the school district that may serve			
4	the recreational, educational, cultural, and social needs of the people of the city. The purpose of this			
5	division is to formalize the city's commitment to collaborate with School District No. 1 and nothing			
6	herein shall be construed to require participation or attendance by committee members. The			
7	committee shall not take any formal action and shall solely be utilized to study and recommend furthe			
8	opportunitie	es for coordination and partnership between the city and School District No.1.

10	Sec. 2-230	Establishment and membership.		
11	There is he	ereby created a city-school coordinating committee which shall consist of the following		
12	members:			
13	(a)	The mayor, or the mayor's designee;		
14	(b)	The director of the office of children affairs or the director's designee;		
15	(c)	Two (2) members of city council, appointed by the president of council ;		
16	(d)	Two (2) members of the board of education of School District No. 1, designated by the		
17	board;			
18	(e)	The superintendent of School District No. 1, or the superintendent's designee; and		
19	(f)	Three (3) residents of the city, as follows:		
20		(1) one (1) of whom shall be an educator in School District No.1 appointed by the		
21	superintendent;			
22		(2) one (1) of whom shall be a principal principal or administrator in School District		
23	No.	1 appointed by the superintendent; and		
24		(3) one (1) of whom shall be a parent of a student currently enrolled in a school in		
25		pol District No.1, a student enrolled in School District No. 1., or a person under the age of		
26	twenty-five (25) formerly enrolled in a school in School District No.1., appointed by the presiden			
27		puncil.		
28		Term of committee members.		
29	(a)	The members of the city-school coordinating committee shall serve for a period of two (2)		
30	years.			
31	(b)	Committee members may be reappointed for successive terms.

33	Sec. 2-232	Vacancies.		

- Any vacancy which occurs on the city-school coordinating committee shall be filled in
 - 2

accordance with the provisions of section 2-230 and the new member so appointed to the committee
shall serve the unexpired term of the person so replaced.

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4 Sec. 2-233. - Officers and bylaws.

5 The city-school coordinating committee shall elect two chairpersons from its membership who 6 shall serve as co-chairs, each of whom shall be from a different category of membership as identified 7 in section 2-230(a)-(f). Co-chair terms and other procedural or operational matters affecting the 8 committee may be set by the committee's bylaws.

10 Sec. 2-234. - Meetings.

(a) The first annual meeting of the committee shall occur no later than March 31st of each
 calendar year.

(b) The annual schedule of regular meetings of the city-school coordinating committee shall
 be established by a majority of the members present, but the commission must meet no less frequently
 than every two (2) months, except as provided in subsection (c).

(c) The co-chairs of the committee may jointly determine to call additional meetings or cancel
 scheduled meetings as needed.

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19 Sec. 2-235. - Purpose.

The purpose of the committee shall be to undertake, on a continuing basis, the study and discussion of all possibilities for cooperation between the city and the school district, which may be referred to the mayor, council, superintendent, and board of education for action by the members belonging to those respective entities, in their sole discretion, as follows:

(a) To study and discuss the development, maintenance, and use of facilities or programs
 authorized by the city and the school district that serve the recreational, educational, social, and
 cultural needs of the people of the city, so as to avoid duplication of expenses and efforts and provide
 facilities and programs which can be used by the greatest number of people possible during the
 maximum periods of time;

(b) To study and discuss needed policies, changes in present operations, practices or
 procedures, including safety policies and procedures;

31 (c) To study and discuss legislative action designed to serve the recreational, educational,
 32 cultural, and social needs of the people of the city;

(d) To study and discuss federal, state, local, and private funds that may be available for
 joint city-school district programs and activities;

1	(e) To study and discuss alternative financing mechanisms that may be available for the			
2	purposes of joint city-school district programs and activities; and			
3	(f) To request assistance from other public agencies and higher educational institutions, as			
4	well as private organizations and agencies, concerned with the educational, recreational, social, and			
5	cultural needs of the people of the city.

7	Sec. 2-236 - No penalty.			
8	The failure by any person to take any action required by this division shall not be subject to any			
9	penalty including the penalty set forth in section 1-13.
