A BILL

For an ordinance assessing the annual costs of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance, and replacement of the Broadway Pedestrian Mall B Local Maintenance District upon the real property, exclusive of improvements thereon, benefited.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. Upon consideration of the recommendation of the Executive Director of the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure that an ordinance be enacted for the purpose of assessing the annual costs of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance, and replacement of the Broadway Pedestrian Mall B Local Maintenance District (“Broadway Pedestrian Mall B”), for the upcoming year, upon the real property, exclusive of improvements thereon, benefited, the Council finds, as follows:

(a) A local maintenance district providing for the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Broadway Pedestrian Mall B, was created by Ordinance No. 840, Series of 1998;

(b) The annual cost of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Broadway Pedestrian Mall B is \$110,356.00, which amount the Executive Director of the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure has the authority to expend for the purposes stated herein;

(c) The Executive Director of the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure has complied with all provisions of law relating to the publishing of notice to the owners of real properties to be assessed and to all persons interested generally, and the Council sitting as a Board of Equalization has heard and determined all written complaints and objections, if any, filed with the Executive Director of the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure;

(d) The portion of the annual costs for the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Broadway Pedestrian Mall B to be assessed against the properties, exclusive of improvements thereon, benefited is \$88,845.40;

(e) The portion of the annual costs of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of the Broadway Pedestrian Mall B to be borne by the City and County of Denver is \$21,510.60; and

1 (f) The real property within the Broadway Pedestrian Mall B will be benefited in an amount
2 equal to or in excess of the amount to be assessed against said property because of the continuing
3 care, operation, repair, maintenance and replacement of said Broadway Pedestrian Mall B.

4 **Section 2.** The annual costs of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance, and
5 replacement of the Broadway Pedestrian Mall B to be assessed against the real properties, exclusive
6 of improvements thereon, benefited are hereby approved.

7 **Section 3.** The annual costs of the continuing care, operation, repair, maintenance, and
8 replacement of the Broadway Pedestrian Mall B in the amount of \$88,845.40 are hereby assessed
9 against the real properties, exclusive of improvements thereon, within said local maintenance district
10 as follows:

11 NOTE: Where a series of lots is followed by "inclusive", the amount appearing after the series shall
12 be the total for all lots in the series. Where a series of lots is not followed by "inclusive", the amount
13 appearing after such series shall be the assessment for each lot in the series.

31	Those portions of the SE ¼, NW ¼ and NE ¼, SW ¼ Section 15, Township 4 South, Range 68 West	
32	of the 6th Principal Meridian located between the south line of the Phase II Broadway Pedestrian	
33	Mall (approximately the centerline of the Center Avenue extended from the east) and a point 180.0	
34	feet north of the northerly right-of-way line of Interstate 25, the west line of South Broadway and a

38 **Section 4.** The assessments made pursuant hereto shall be a lien in the several amounts
39 assessed against each lot or tract of land set forth in Section 3 herein, and such lien shall have the
40 priority of the lien for local public improvement districts.

41 **Section 5.** Without demand, said assessments as set forth in Section 3 herein, shall be due
42 and payable on the first day of January of the year next following the year in which this assessing


1 ordinance became effective, and said assessments shall become delinquent if not paid by the last
2 day of February of the year next following the year in which this assessing ordinance became
3 effective. A failure to pay said assessments as hereinabove set forth shall become a lien on the
4 property subject to the assessment, and such lien may be sold by the City as provided by the Charter
5 and ordinances of the City and County of Denver.


6 **Section 6.** Any unspent revenue and revenue generated through investment shall be
7 retained and credited to the Broadway Pedestrian Mall B Local Maintenance District for future long
8 term or program maintenance of the District.
