Dear Mayor and City Councilors,

I am writing in support of a local ordinance that makes a beverage option like water or unflavored milk (including a non-dairy substitute) the standard in kids' meal menus across the City of Denver.

Community members' lives are busy, and increasingly, families are grabbing a meal on the go. In fact, Americans now spend more of their food budget on foods prepared away from home than on foods at home. Therefore, what kids eat at restaurants matters now more than ever. The added sugar in sugary drinks typically offered with a kids' meal exceeds the recommended amount of sugar a child should have in an entire day. Sugary drink consumption increases the risk of type II diabetes, tooth decay, cancer, and heart disease. Additionally, the disproportionate marketing of sugary drinks to children of color drives higher consumption of sugary drinks, creating roadblocks to health equity. This ordinance removes the marketing of sugary drinks on kids' meal menus and supports kids and families with making life-long healthier choices.

The mission of Westwood Unidos is "To unify and organize resident leaders and community-based organizations to take positive action on the topics residents identify as most important." Thus, as a team of health-equity champions, an ordinance that prioritizes children's health and eliminates the marketing of unhealthy beverages at Denver restaurants is near and dear to our hearts. Together, we can help make healthy choices easier for families while they dine out. This can have an amazing impact on children's long-term health. We are constantly looking to innovate in ways that protect the well-being of our community and ensure a bright future for our children. That is why we support a policy to create healthier default beverage choices for kids' meals in Denver.
